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A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Congratulations to all our First Communicants this weekend!

These second grade students join us after diligent study and practice to participate in the core of our worship. They no longer have to cross their arm when approaching the minister at Communion time, but finally receive Jesus' gift to us, the gift of himself. May each of these new Communicants participate and know Jesus is with them for the rest of their lives.



Congratulations to the parents, siblings, grandparents, other family and friends who have encouraged this First Communion class to bring them to this day. May God bless each of you abundantly for the good example you have shown and the practice you have modeled.

You may have heard that the U.S. bishops have called all of us to a 'Eucharistic Revival.' This call will culminate in a national celebration and gathering in 2024. (Details will follow.) Every parish has been called to participate in this culminating gathering, and we have been asked to do some things locally. In September , a diocesan wide event will take place. (Again, details will follow.) But at a more local level we can participate, by reflecting on our Masses, using the opportunities that our church is open almost every day from early morning until approximately 5pm for prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and trying to especially attend for a visit on First Fridays, when the Eucharist is put on the altar in a monstrance with many keeping watch from the time the morning Mass concludes to about 5pm.

Pope Benedict wrote a letter/encyclical in 2007 entitled: *Sacramentum Caritatis*. I recommend all to read this great letter as a personal way of participating in the 'revival' that the bishops have called for us to embrace. Pope Benedict calls for three components for Eucharistic Revival: the Eucharist is a mystery to be believed, a mystery to be celebrated, and a mystery to be lived. I would like to try to address all three components over the next few weeks. Today a few words from various sources presenting: *the mystery to be believed*.:

"The holy Eucharist completes Christian initiation. Those who have been raised to the dignity of the royal priesthood by Baptism and configured more deeply to Christ by Confirmation participate with the whole community in the Lord's own sacrifice by means of the Eucharist."

"In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith: "Our way of thinking is attuned to the Eucharist, and the Eucharist in turn confirms our way of thinking.

The doctrine of the Holy Eucharist consist of that of the Eucharistic sacrifice, the sacrificial meal, and the sacrificial food, or to express it otherwise, it consists of the doctrine of the Mass, of Communion, and of the Real Presence. There is no presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament that is not meant first and foremost as food for the faithful people, and there is no sacramental union with Christ in Holy Communion that is not to be thought of as a sacrificial meal: 'For as often as you shall eat this bread, and drink the chalice, you shall show the death of the Lord, until he come' (1 Cor. 11:26). The Eucharistic meal can only be prepared in the sacrifice of the Mass.

Thus the mystery of the Eucharist summarizes the whole mystery of our redemption. There are two fundamental relationships in which Christ stands to us. First, he is our priestly mediator with God, and offers him atonement for our sins. But Christ is not a stranger to us, who merely represents us as a propitiator before God. He comes to us in the second relationship by being the

mediator of the grace which God gives us on account of his sacrifice. That is the mystery of our union with Christ who is the source of all grace for us. 'And of his fullness we have all received, grace for grace' (John 1:16).

This second community is realized only in the sacrifice of the Cross, by his giving his life for his Church which he had to ransom from himself. Only in death did Christ seal the deep covenant with the Church whereby she is purified and sanctified and which according to the teaching of St. Paul is the image of the most intimate union of human being in marriage: 'Husbands, love your wives, as Christ also loved the Church and delivered himself up for it; that he might sanctify it, cleansing it by the laver of water in the word of life' (Eph. 5:25). From the opened side of our crucified Savior the Church was first born, as Eve was taken from Adam's side. That is the most ancient way of expressing this truth.

This two-fold relationship, then, in which Christ stands to us men, as our mediator before God and the bringer of all graces from God, lives on in the mystery of the Eucharist. The Mass is the renewing of the sacrifice which Christ offered for us, of the sacrifice of atonement for our sins; but the sacrifice is also at the same time the preparation of the Eucharistic meal, the sacrament of our union with Christ in grace and a foretaste of the union we will have with God in heaven.

We should not be surprised if the doctrine of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament occurs more than most doctrines in the documents of the Church. There are few mysteries of faith where the mystery is so evident and therefore so exposed to the attacks of heresy and unbelief. However, the militant position of the Church should not prevent us from seeing the Real Presence in the context of the whole Eucharistic mystery.

Doctrine about the Eucharistic sacrament, sacrificial meal, and sacrificial food:

- The Holy Eucharist is a true sacrament, instituted by Christ. Christ is really present in the Holy Eucharist, even when not being received. It is therefore to be honored and adored. The whole Christ is present in either kind or is received by the communicant. For the wheat bread and grape wine are transubstantiated by the ordained priest into the flesh and blood of Christ so that only the appearance of bread and wine remains.
- The sacrament effects union with Christ; it is nourishment for the soul, gives increase in grace and remits venial sin and punishment.

May the gift that we believe, celebrate and live in guide us in the coming week and for the rest of our lives!
