

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Congratulations again to our First Communion recipients! The beautiful banner placed on the altar last week with images of the First Communicants hands reminds all of us that we are the Body of Christ. Our hands are now Christ's hands. As these girls and boys grow in closeness to the Lord with the frequent reception of Communion, may we all rejoice that another generation has received God's



most precious gift to us. May their example remind us of the love God has for all of us. As we heard the story of the two disciples walking on the road to Emmaus, may we recognize Jesus for he is always ready to walk with each of us!

A couple of weeks ago, when announcements were made about the financial situation of the diocese, it coincided with the kick-off for the annual Bishop's Ministries Appeal collection. Our goal has been the same for the past several years and two years ago we surpassed 100% of our goal and last year we came close but did not reach 100%. We chose not to show the video about the appeal in church because it was being initiated later than last year and we had several other worthy second collections during the month of March. We are grateful for your ongoing support to each of these worthy causes, in addition to a special collection when another terrible earthquake ravaged Turkey and the Sudan. I urge you to go to the diocesan website or the Friday Flocknote and look at this year's video about the Bishop's Ministries Appeal. It is only a two and half minute video but encapsulates where these funds go to support important programs that assure all the "Christ promised to be with us always' in our diocese.

You have heard about a cumulation of lawsuits against the diocese. None of the funds that are donated to the Bishop's Ministries Appeal will be accessible to settling any lawsuit, but will only go to help religious education programs, programs for the poor, support of our seminary students and all that is mentioned in the video and materials about this annual collection. May God abundantly bless your ongoing generosity toward our parish, school, and diocese! Jesus is always with us is a reality because of your commitment and care.

This weekend we come together for the now 'annual ravioli dinner' named in honor of Irene Crosetti, who when the possibility of a crab feed became difficult, came up and gathered some wonderful women who put on the first ravioli dinner a few years ago. I hope many of you remember Irene with Margaret at the church door each week. They knew every child's name and encouraged them with every challenge and success they faced. Margaret and others continue this legacy, but we welcome the Crosetti family and friends to this gathering and are grateful for the kind donation of wine to facilitate this event. I know Irene's spirit is with us and she rejoices that we continue to care and enjoy each other as part of the presence of Jesus in our midst.

If you watch the bishop's campaign message, he mentions the Eucharistic revival all the U.S. bishops have called for over the next few years. Last week, I started to reflect on the gift that the Eucharist is to us. Believing that the bread and wine at Mass become the complete body, mind, and spirit of Jesus. This can happen because of what we proclaim every Sunday, that Jesus is Risen. The resurrected state frees Jesus from the confines of space and time which is why Jesus can truly be present according to our beliefs when two or more of us gather in His name, when the scriptures are proclaimed to us and preached about and when we gather for Mass and remember him and his words: 'this is my Body, this is my Blood' during the liturgy of the Eucharist.

When we receive, we become the Christ bearers. When we are dismissed at the end of Mass, we are charged with bringing Christ into the world by what we say and do. We show Christ to the world by our compassion, forgiveness, care of the poor and immigrant. We bring Christ's healing touch when we visit the sick, listen to someone burdened, share what we have with those who have little or nothing. This is part of what the Eucharistic Revival is about. We reflect and renew what Jesus commanded us to do so it will be strengthened and renewed in case it has just become routine or less important.

I am grateful that the parish social justice team provided some very interesting and pertinent information about our stewardship of the world itself. Composting and having a garden offers many ways we can show respect for our environment and utilize better the gifts and resources we have and hope to preserve for generations to come. St. Paul in several places speaks of the whole world which will be transformed on the great day of Resurrection at the end of time. Thanks to the group that is pointing us to reflect on the wonderful and amazing world that itself will be fully transformed one day.

Next weekend our bishop will be here for a special Confirmation Mass at 11am. I have now interviewed all of the candidates and I am happy to report that they are a great group of individuals who will be fully initiated into the Church by receiving this sacrament. I always ask each candidate on becoming fully initiated, what ministry (ies) do they see themselves doing as fully initiated members of the Church ( Lector, Cantor, Eucharistic Minister, member of the Pastoral Council, leader at next year's Confirmation program, etc.) I am happy to report on some very positive responses that will keep us vibrant as a parish. I ask that all of us pray extra for those who will be confirmed next weekend. May the extra prayers and grace of the Holy Spirit bless each young candidate and may they in turn carry that Spirit into our parish and world!

Continuing some words about the Eucharistic revival, Cardinal Cupich of Chicago offers a short reflection on Pope Francis' direction for us and this revival.:

Pope Francis gives new life to the Council's efforts by reminding us that the liturgy is the school where we learn and are empowered to take up the mission of Christ as members of the Body of Christ. It is precisely in our worship that we are continually renewed in our baptismal call to participate in Christ's work of saving the world.

As the pope observes in "Desiderio Desideravi," "liturgical celebration frees us from the prison of a self-referencing nourished by one's own reasoning and one's own feeling. The action of the celebration does not belong to the individual but to the Christ-Church, to the totality of the faithful united in Christ. The liturgy does not say 'I' but 'we.'"

The liturgy also serves as an antidote to the presumption that we can save ourselves: "Participating in the Eucharistic sacrifice is not our own achievement," Francis continues, "as if because of it we could boast before God or before our brothers and sisters. The beginning of every celebration reminds me who I am, asking me to confess my sin and inviting me to implore the Blessed Mary ever virgin, the angels, and saints and all my brothers and sisters to pray for me to the Lord our God."

Herein lies our understanding of the mystery involved in our worship. Christ not only saves us but invites us to join him in bringing about the salvation of the world. Pope Francis has more to say about the sense of mystery, which some claim we have lost in the liturgical reforms, which I will take up in Part III of this series.
