



A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Sincere thanks to the volunteers who helped at the 'workday' last Saturday. It is gratifying when I witness parishioners take ownership of the parish and care for a patch of the facilities that all who come here to pray or learn will immediately notice how this parish community



welcomes and cares for all who come to us every week or on occasion or for an event like a wedding, funeral, First Communion, or other parish event.

Again, I advertise and hope by word of mouth we can find a part-time handyperson, bookkeeper, and young adult catechetical coordinator. I ask as Keri did at Mass a few weeks ago, that even if we don't know someone, we pray all of these positions will soon be filled.

You have noticed in the past few flock notes that the diocese continues to hold events during the three-year Eucharistic revival call. This coming week and for the rest of the school year each month there will be a 'holy hour' on Wednesdays in the church with exposition and a theme that will be meditated on during the hour. The actual Rite for Exposition does not call for silent prayer throughout the hours we have the exposition as we do on First Fridays from 9am to 4:30pm. I encourage you to come and experience this on Wednesday night. We will be using a service provided by the USCCB during our revival.

An important facet of the revival is also to understand the theology of this most precious gift God gives us. I wrote and have received permission from the Australian Bishops' Conference to reprint some of a very short book on our faith. I will include some parts of the chapters on the Eucharist this week and over the next few weeks.

"Eucharist stems from a Greek work meaning 'thanksgiving'. In Holy Communion, the Eucharist, Jesus Christ is really present under the appearance of bread and wine. This

teaching has been consistent since Jesus shared the Last Supper with the Apostles. (cf. Mark 14:22-24)

At Mass, Catholics receive Holy Communion, the Body and Blood of the risen Lord under the appearance of bread and wine. Over the last 100 years, there have been extraordinary developments in the field of interpreting the Scriptures. One principle that has developed for interpreting Scripture is the idea of working to understand the intention of the sacred author when he wrote the Gospel. That is what was the author trying to communicate to his original audience?

Scripture scholarship has confirmed, enriched, and enlivened our understanding of the Eucharist. The scholars tell us that the use of the symbols of *bread and wine* and *blood and covenant* in the context of a meal, draws on a rich tradition in Jewish teaching and practice.

At the Last Supper, through symbolic action, Jesus bought together six related but separate things: **1.** The Passover, when the Hebrews captive in Egypt marked the doorposts of their homes with the blood of a lamb; upon seeing this sign, the spirit of the Lord *passed over* these homes saving them from a terrible plague (Exodus 12:21-28). **2.**The Exodus of the Hebrews from slavery in Egypt and the food (manna) provided by God in the desert. (Exodus 16) **3.**meals that Jesus shared with the outcasts of society (Luke 19:1-10; Mark 14:3-9). **4.** His death on the cross (Mt. 27:32-55; Mark 15:21-40; Jn 19:17-37; Luke 23:26-49). **5.** His rising from the dead (Mt 28, Mark 16, Luke 24, Jn 20 and 21). **6.** The image of the huge banquet where he will preside when he brings creation to completion at the end of time (Lk 14:15-24; Mt. 22:1-14).

In the Eucharist, at the one time, the Passover, the Exodus, Jesus' dining with outcasts, the Last Supper, the Crucifixion, the Resurrection, and an anticipation of the return of Christ in glory are all remembered and made present in the Body and Blood of the risen Lord under the appearance of bread and wine.
