

about the Mass and the Eucharist revival we are part of in the Church right now.

(*Continued from last week*) "The Catholic Church teaches what Jesus taught about the gift of the Eucharist. That is, Jesus is the bread that has come down from heaven, his flesh is real food, and his blood is real drink, and anyone who eats this bread will live forever. Holy Communion is indeed a great gift to every member of the Catholic Church.

Unlike Baptism and Confirmation, which are sacraments that we receive only once, Catholics are welcome to participate in Mass and receive the Bread of God, Holy Communion, every day.

Eucharistic adoration is also possible in our churches many hours of the day. (Here at St. Theresa, the church doors are open before 8am and are closed around 5pm. Many stop in for a few moments during any day and seeing the candle lit near the tabernacle, are comforted by a special intimacy and communion with God.

For Catholics, the celebration of the Eucharist, the Mass, is the center of their life of faith. The Mass is the summit towards which the activity of the Church is directed. It is also the heart and soul of the Church. The gospel account of the encounter with Jesus by two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35) puts a spotlight on the Mass. (*To be continued*).
