

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

At the conclusion of the Mass, the priest or deacon sends us forth to carry what we have heard and with the nourishment of Word and Sacrament into the world. We are the 'Christ bearers. We are sent to transform the world by our daily lives as Christ would transform it. We bless as Christ blessed the children, we forgive



as Jesus often forgave the sinner, we proclaim the Kingdom by what we say and do and feed the crowds with little that becomes enough for everyone to have their fill.

Most don't put on a roman collar or a nun's veil to do this. We simply radiate Christ by how we treat the members of our family, our co-workers at out jobs, the clerks we encounter in the stores and other places our week takes us. We have real guidance on how to treat our neighbor.

Last week, we re-commissioned the catechists in our parish in both our religious education program and in our parochial school. I ask all to pray for all our students and the teachers that reveal the mysteries of God's Kingdom by what they teach and how they conduct their classes and lives. May God's love, wisdom and compassion abound among us!

Continuing the reflections on the Eucharist, last week the column mentioned the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35). * "In the story of happenings on the road to Emmaus, Jesus walked beside two disciples. Although they walked together, something prevented the disciples from recognizing Jesus. On the journey the disciples talked about the recent events that had occurred in Jerusalem.

As the disciples appeared to be disappointed and confused, Jesus asked what they were discussing. Astounded that the stranger did not know what had happened one of them related the events and told him of confusing reports that Jesus' body was missing and that some of their group had been told by an angel that Jesus was alive.

Jesus then told them stories from the Hebrew Scriptures, starting with Moses and going through all the prophets,

explaining the passages in the Scriptures that referred to himself.

When they drew near to the village to which they were going, the disciples asked the knowledgeable stranger to stay with them. As they began to share a meal, Jesus took bread, blessed it, broke it, and handed it to them. At this, their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; but he vanished from their sight.

Startled by this amazing event, the disciples said to each other: Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, he was opening the Scriptures to us? (Luke 24:32.)

They set out that instant and returned to Jerusalem. There they found the eleven gathered together. They were saying: The Lord has risen indeed and has appeared to Simon. The two disciples told their story of what had happened on the road to Emmaus and how they had recognized Jesus at the breaking of the bread.

There are many parallels between the Catholic Mass and this story:

- Christ is always with us, although we may not recognize his presence.
- It is not unusual to come to prayer perhaps disheartened and confused as to what God might be doing in our life.
- As Jesus explained the Scriptures so also at Mass the Scriptures are proclaimed in the readings and explained in the homily.
- At Mass we recognize Jesus as truly present in the bread blessed, broken and shared.
- Like the disciples on recognizing the risen Lord, the task of the Christian is to go out and tell others the Good News that Jesus is risen from the dead.
