A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

celebration was a great success because of each and every one of you! And so many of the girls and boys had a great time that it is well worth doing it again. And the scouts were dutifully stationed at every garbage unit to make sure we separated the disposables in the right place so we can avoid the fines that come quickly when we miss.

Special thanks has to go to Cathy Brady who coordinated the set-up, the programs, and preparations for the Mass. And very special thanks goes to Keri Nims who coordinated the whole event. She took care of the advertisement, purchase of food items, sign ups for meal options and just making it look like an effortless endeavor. Believe me, a lot of work went toward making this a success that just doesn't get seen. I hope all of us will say a prayer of praise for everyone involved last week.

As I mentioned, this was the 98th Celebration of our parish. In just two short years, we turn 100. Now is the time to start thinking about how we will celebrate this jubilee year of being a Catholic community under the banner and patronage of St. Theresa, the little flower.

Last week, I presented some of the fervent love that St. Theresa exhibited in receiving and speaking about the Eucharist. Her words help us continue to reflect on the great gift God has given us in Jesus' presence in Holy Communion. I again thank Fr. Roger Landry for these words:

For St. Thérèse, the Holy Eucharist Is the Big Secret Behind the Little Way

"The Little Flower regarded the rare and precious gift of Holy Communion as something for which there was no price too high to pay.

Thérèse left us a guide as to how she would prepare for Holy Communion:

I picture my soul as a piece of land and beg the Blessed Virgin to remove from it any rubbish that would prevent it from being free; then I ask her to set up a huge tent worthy of heaven, adorning it with her own jewelry; finally, I invite all the angels and saints to come and conduct a magnificent concert there. It seems to me that when Jesus descends into my heart, he is content to find himself so well received and I, too, am content.

The year before she died, she wrote a beautiful poem entitled *My Wishes Before the Tabernacle*, in which she compared herself to the tabernacle key, the sanctuary lamp, the altar stone, the corporal, the monstrance, the paten for the host, the chalice and the grapes and wheat that are the raw materials for the Eucharistic sacrifice.

The poem witnesses to the depth of her Eucharistic faith but also to her prayerful familiarity with these objects as Church history's most famous sacristan.

She begged for faith like the tabernacle key, to open the place where the God of love resides and for the grace to burn like the sanctuary lamp to draw many souls to Christ's Eucharistic love.

She asked for her soul to be a fitting place, like the altar stone and the Bethlehem stable, for Christ to rest, and for her heart to be like a beautiful corporal to receive him purely.

She petitioned to be like a priest's paten to hold him, like a monstrance to reveal him, and like a chalice where his saving blood might flow anew.

She entreated to be a ripe grape crushed each day to unite her sufferings to Christ's blood, and a grain of wheat falling to the ground and dying so that she might be transformed into her Eucharistic spouse and with him bear much fruit.

As we celebrate the quasquicentennial of St. Thérèse's birth into eternal life, we ask her intercession to live the Eucharistic lessons she teaches us, so that receiving the food of everlasting life with love like hers, we might come to experience alongside her the joy of the eternal banquet."
