

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

We have celebrated All Saints and All Souls days this past week and these great feasts give us some guidance on how we are nourished along the way and what that nourishment compels us to do every day. The Eucharist nourishes us to then



'act justly, love tenderly and walk day by day humbly with God. In these disturbing times of war and violence far away and sometimes close to our own neighborhoods, continuing to focus on these matters may help us when we just don't know what we can do to make a difference. Here is a short reflection on the Eucharist that compels us to work for justice and peace parts taken from a parish bulletin in Helena, MO.:

"The Eucharist, as we know, is the source and summit of our faith. It is the power of Christ that comes into our hearts to give us the wisdom and strength to follow Him in our daily lives. The Eucharist unites us to Christ and cleanses us of our sins. The power of the Eucharist strengthens our charity; our love for God and one another; our kindness and compassion for the poor and the suffering because it is love incarnate who comes into our hearts to strengthen our love for God and for one another. The Eucharist strengthens our unity and love of the Church, as we are one Body; one Spirit in Christ. In the celebration of the Eucharist, we anticipate eternal love, and the glory of heaven; where every tear will be wiped away, and we will be in the presence of our Lord forever.

Every time we celebrate the Eucharist, we receive in our hearts the food for immortality; the food for the journey that strengthens us for the place we strive for every day of our lives. When a Eucharistic celebration takes place, those who have gone before us, and those who will come after us are present, because God is not limited by space or time, and God is love, and the creator of the heavens and the earth is present in the Eucharist.

Participating in the Eucharist identifies us with the heart of Christ, as His Body and Blood are truly present in our souls; giving us the strength to bring His light to the world. It is in the Eucharist that Christ works in the complete transformation of all of us; helping us to grow in holiness and love of the Lord and each other every day of our lives. "

Nourished with the Bread of Life, we are then nourished and enabled to act in two different but complimentary ways so we can follow the path of love which are called the 'two feet of love in action: social justice and charitable works. Both ways of following the path of love involve treating people respectfully, not oppressing them, standing with them in solidarity and providing support.

"Social justice 'concerns the social, political and economic aspects of and above all, the structural dimensions of problems and their respective solutions." Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church, no. 201

Charitable works are the 'response to immediate needs. Pope Benedict XVI in *Deus Caritas Est, no. 31:* The goal is to create a society where all people have the support, the opportunity, and the infrastructure to become the people God created them to be.

We believe in following the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Our response as disciples is based on the teaching of Jesus as expressed in the scriptures, Catholic Social Teaching, and the corporal and spiritual works of mercy. We hold these teachings in our hearts and prayers, our thoughts, and words, and in our actions. St. Theresa of Calcutta encourages us to server for "the love of Jesus, for the glory of God, and for the common good." We believe that all people are created with love in the image and likeness of God and reflect his glory. We believe in Namaste, "The God in me beholds the God in you."

The foundation of Catholic Social Teaching will be presented next week.
