A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Gratitude to all in the Men's Club who made the annual Pancake breakfast a great success! About one hundred bought advanced tickets, but the wise counsel in the Men's Club knew more would come and a total of two hundred and twenty-five had a great breakfast. The children



had a great time and Santa took a picture with many of them. I am very grateful for some of the newer younger men in the parish who stepped up and made it look easy.

This advent is ever so short, but I am happy that Advent by Candlelight for our parish women, Advent for families and Advent for men all has great moments. I was able to attend the men's session and thirty men prayed and had wonderful fellowship in the midst of this fast season.

Next week will be both the Fourth Sunday of Advent and then Christmas Eve in the afternoon. Words from my priest friend, Fr. Ron Schmit help us focus and what we celebrate:

"Let the heavens be glad and the earth rejoice! Psalm 96:11

800 years ago, St Francis of Assisi created the first Nativity. On Christmas night of 1223, St Francis wanted to celebrate the Feast of Christmas, the coming in the flesh of Christ Jesus. The caves around the town of Greccio reminded him of the caves that he saw while he was in Bethlehem in the Holy Land.

One of those caves is where it is said that Jesus was born. Francis wanted the average poor folk to understand that God has taken on our humanity with all the complications that entails.

St. Francis chose a cave. He had someone build an animal feed box. Some of his brothers filled that box with hay. When Francis arrived, he found the manger filled with hay, nearby the ox, and the donkey. He placed a living baby in the feed box. The people flocked to the place with candles and torches. They were all filled with unspeakable joy they had never experienced before.

At that first Nativity there were no statues, the scene was recreated by those who were present. Then the parish priest celebrated the Mass, showing the connection between the Incarnation of the of the Son of God and the Eucharist. In the Eucharist, the Risen Christ takes flesh in us. We are now the risen body of Christ. Christ lives in our reality and day to day lives.

Incarnation means God takes on our humanity. Born into poverty, Jesus would know the trauma that many in our world face each day. Incarnation tells us that the memory of trauma and oppression is now in the eternal body of God. God will never forget. God will heal it even if it is not on our own timetable. We discern the Christ's presence in the faces of one another, but especially the poor and those on the margins.

Pope Francis reminds us that there are two signs at Christmas that guide us in recognizing Jesus. One is the sky full of stars. He says there are an infinity of stars but among them a special star that stands out. This is the star that prompted the Magi to leave their home and begin a journey that would lead them where they did not know. It happens in our lives.

At a certain time, a special "star" invites us to decide, to make a choice, and begin a journey. We have to ask God to show us the star that leads us to Jesus.

On that Holy Night we find another powerful sign: the smallness of God. The angels point the poor shepherds to a baby placed in the feed box of animals. Not a sign of power, self-sufficiency, or pride. No. The eternal God is reduced to the helplessness of a tiny baby. God lowers himself so that we could walk with him, and he can stand beside us, not above and far from us. The feast Christmas invites us to call forth awe and wonder in the God who dwells with us.

This Christmas make your home a manger that welcomes those who need love and comfort. In them see the face of Christ."
