A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Merry Christmas! Happy New Year!

The days of Christmas continue, and I am grateful for all who made last weekend's Saturday, Sunday and Monday wonderful celebrations of the season. The decorators moved fast since they only



had Sunday morning after Mass to get ready for Christmas Eve! The choir and added young musicians were the best ever, even with Rob, our music director afflicted with pneumonia!

Cathy Brady coordinated it all and I am so grateful for those who stepped up to lector and distribute Holy Communion. Sacristans, the wonderful person who washes and irons the purificators and towels we use at Mass, sound and video coordinators and our amazing greeters are just some of those who made the days special. Keri Nims really made the 'Nativity Pageant' memorable for our little ones even with a shortage of shepherds. And I promise next year to not leave out the lambs, but when they baaa'd their way into the presentation a new St. T memory was written.

Happily, further away from Covid, more attended all of the services. We are seeing a steady increase and that is wonderful as we head into the 99th year since the parish was established. This is the year we plan for our centenary celebration, and I am ready to listen to all your suggestions.

Our annual 'listening sessions' will soon be here and I am grateful to all who have responded to my special end of the year appeal. Some have been quite generous, which makes our day to day functioning easier. On the January listening sessions days, all of the Masses will be offered for the benefactors who continue to support the ministries and our operations as a parish. May the Lord bless a hundred-fold every dollar you have given and will give in the coming new year.

The New Year's Day Mass for many years was a special Mass for peace. Sadly, we enter 2024 with horrific wars being waged. We get only a small glimpse of the wars in Ukraine and Palestine, Gaza, and Israel. I beg

all to pray for peace every day! I encourage you to support local peace movements and those more global. We can bring peace to our world as the Lord intends. I want to share a letter I received from a priest who is in Bethlehem. Fr. Bernard Poggi was born and raised in San Mateo but is a priest in Palestine and the among other things the rector of the seminary in the Patriarchate. As I ask all to commit in the New Year for peace, may his description help us focus on the needs of many.:

"In Bethlehem, we feel lonely and isolated; all the roads to Jerusalem are closed, no pilgrims fill our streets, and the grotto is cold and empty. Yet, the Incarnation, God becoming a man, is the very reason we have hope. Without Jesus, we have no hope and only death to look forward to (1 Thessalonians 4:13– 14). We are reminded if God is with us, who can be against us. (ref. Romans 8:31)

In Genesis we read that God originally created a perfect world (Genesis 1:31), but it was soon marred by Adam and Eve's sin. The consequence for sin was death (Genesis 2:17; Romans 6:23). However, even during the darkest day in history, God offered a message of hope, "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and her Seed; He shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise His heel" (Genesis 3:15). God promised that He would send a Savior who would conquer Satan and deal with the problem of death and suffering.

This year, we earnestly call out – Come Lord Jesus, look at the suffering of your people and save us. Yesterday, after meeting with families from Gaza who live in Bethlehem, I can assure you that they are desperate. It is not about food, water, electricity, and medicine anymore, it is about wanting to leave, wanting not to live in fear, wanting to sleep a full night in a bed. They are desperate, and their families are too, please keep them in your prayers, and call out with them, Come Lord Jesus, look at the suffering of your people and save us.

He is our hope, he is our salvation, and he is our promise for a better future."
