#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Lent! I invite you to have a good journey and to check out the possibilities offered by your parish to help that journey. Deacon Mike will be leading the annual retreat over the Sundays of Lent. In



addition, several trained 'spiritual directors' are available to you for individual guidance and counsel.

Fr. Ngema once again will lead those interested on Tuesday nights deeper into the Scriptures. He has been making great progress in his scriptures and has much to offer. The school will participate in Stations of the Cross each Friday, and you are welcome to join them. The schedule is on the website.

Once again, a Seder dinner is planned. We remember that in three of the Gospel accounts, the Last Supper takes place at a Jewish Seder dinner and commemoration. If you have never been or want to renew and see how our Mass is now inspired by this commemoration, plan to attend. Details in the Flocknote and on the website.

Lenten books that provide a short meditation each day are available in the vestibule. They have guided many through the years and we hope this year's edition does the same. Your offering defrays every increasing cost of providing this book to all in the parish.

Did you see the 'Super Bowl commercial' with Mark Walhberg inviting us to pray during Lent? Help make the 7 million that someone paid worth their money. The short 30 seconds was indeed inspiring and unexpected in the middle of our tense watching of the game.

With Lent so early, we will be celebrating First Communion and Confirmation in April this year. I invite all to pray for our young people who will receive these sacraments, that God will enrich their lives forever with these gifts of our salvation.

Much can be said of Lent, but a few words from our Holy Father, I hope will inspire a good forty days:

It is time to act, and in Lent, to act also means to pause. To pause in prayer, in order to receive the word of God, to pause like the Samaritan in the presence of a wounded brother or sister. Love of God and love of neighbor are one love. Not to have other gods is to pause in the presence of God beside the flesh of our neighbor. For this reason, prayer, almsgiving and fasting are not three unrelated acts, but a single movement of openness and self-emptying, in which we cast out the idols that weigh us down, the attachments that imprison us. Then the atrophied and isolated heart will revive. Slow down, then, and pause! The contemplative dimension of life that Lent helps us to rediscover will release new energies. In the presence of God, we become brothers and sisters, more sensitive to one another: in place of threats and enemies, we discover companions and fellow travelers. This is God's dream, the promised land to which we journey once we have left our slavery behind.

I invite every Christian community to do just this: to offer its members moments set aside to rethink their lifestyles, times to examine their presence in society and the contribution they make to its betterment. Woe to us if our Christian penance were to resemble the kind of penance that so dismayed Jesus. To us too, he says: "Whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting" (Mt 6:16). Instead, let others see joyful faces, catch the scent of freedom, and experience the love that makes all things new, beginning with the smallest and those nearest to us. This can happen in every one of our Christian communities.

On more mundane matter, please get your Irene Crosetti Ravioli tickets. You don't want to miss this great social in our parish.

Also, we congratulate and are so proud of all the St. Theresa Students who were sent to the Diocesan Science Fair. All eight won and placed at the competition which brought 180 different projects from most of our Catholic Schools. The list of winners can be found on the school webpage. One student won the top award and will go to the County and then State Science fair. We should all be very proud of these accomplishments.
