

## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

As the school year begins, some mark that the summer is ending. We welcomed back students to St. Theresa School this past Monday and we celebrate the 'Back to School' Mass with a concert and picnic that follows on Saturday.



Over the summer many changes were made in the school to respond to changing needs and overall to make what has been rated good even better. Contractors and parent volunteers did major work to move the school library into what had been the computer classroom and then create a larger space for a growing T-Kindergarten room in the former library space. The space that had been the T-Kindergarten room goes back to being a decent break room for the teachers and staff and a small meeting room for the School Board and other committees that meet throughout the year.

In the main school building, classrooms now are in order when in the past they were not. Since the junior high classes change classrooms, it is good to now have them located in the same area. Every classroom also received a fresh coat of paint.

I hope you will take a look when it is offered at the amazing work our principal, staff members, volunteer parents and others have done. As we bless the school community on Saturday night, may God's love and providence help this to be a best year for all.

One new T-K student is the third generation to begin school at St. Theresa. We will display a picture of grandfather, his daughter and her son posing as a new generation begins the fine education that St. Theresa school have provided over many years. We begin the year with Mass because the mission of all Catholic schools is to educate a person in body, mind, and spirit. This parish has supported that since 1958 when the school welcomed its first classes. Thanks to all who continue that legacy as part of the mission of this parish.

You will also soon see scaffolding on the church building. A fresh coat of paint will soon be applied.

When the diocesan official came out to review the project, he acknowledged this was overdue. We are grateful that the high costs of repairing the Event Center are behind us and we can finally work on other projects around the parish plant. The painting should take about four weeks once the contractors get going and it should not interfere with any access or services in the church, parish hall and STEP.

Over the summer, the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary Jubilee committee met. It has been decided to start the celebrations this coming January culminating in a great celebration in October around the feast of St. Theresa and the actual date of the establishment of St. Theresa parish a hundred years ago. I have expressed on several occasions that I want our celebrations to be fun, accessible to those who want to participate with something offered to all. We will have events for the children, our youth, alumni, volunteers, parents and grandparents, former staff, and neighbors. The school community will sponsor a couple of joint ventures that I hope many will enjoy, like the annual Auction. Please stay tuned and read the flock note for the latest information.

With September right around the corner, the country will focus on a national election. The parish social justice committee is sponsoring a Sunday afternoon with speakers from the Catholic Worker community and the Jesuit School of Theology on September 22. Details will follow. I will also be presenting some information to help us guide our path. The important thing to say is that if you are not registered to vote, there is time to do so. And I firmly encourage all to exercise this right and responsibility in our lives.

Both of our student-priests are away on vacation. Fr. Ngema comes back the first week of September and Fr. Abraham will be back toward the end of September. We welcome Fr. Mike Tedone, SJ today after his ordination in May. He comes back to celebrate Mass for us on Sunday and thank us for the support we have given him over the past few years that helped him reach his ordination day. May God bless him with many, many happy years as a priest!
