#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Today we celebrate 'Catechetical Sunday,' and we ask God's blessing on all who teach our faith especially the children of the parish and the rest of us who are on a lifelong journey of growing closer to the



Lord. I invite you to say this prayer this week and throughout the coming school year for our catechists. This prayer is taken from the USCCB website:

Loving Father we pray for our catechists. We thank you for their gift of ministry within your Church.

Grant them your wisdom so that they may grow in the understanding and teaching of your Word. Grant them also your love that they may be fruitful heralds of your Word and lead others to love you.

Pour out your Holy Spirit upon them to grant them wisdom about what is important; knowledge of the truths of faith; understanding of their meaning; right judgement about how to apply them in life; courage to persevere even in the face of adversity; reverence before all that is sacred and holy; and that loving zeal which leads others to a transforming encounter with your Son. We pray this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

As you pray for our catechists, please thank them for their service and encourage them in the path that serves us all.

I am happy to welcome in everyone's name, Joey Gutierrez who has been hired onto our parish staff to minister as a youth minister and Confirmation preparation coordinator. Joey has already experienced some culture shock as he has moved from Texas to primarily study and complete a M. Div theology program at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley as a step toward working and completing a doctoral program.

Joey has worked in several Catholic parishes in the San Antonio archdiocese where he has also ministered as a pastoral musician, choir director, youth minister, parish administrator and facilitator of several outreaches to the homeless and poor. The parishes he leaves behind are upset that he has left them.

Recently I was in a conversation with someone who asked what the purpose of Catholic schools is, Catechetical programs, Confirmation programs and youth ministry. Before I could respond one of our parishioners who was nearby quickly interjected in the conversation and answered: to get our children to heaven.

I cannot say it better. Everything we do, from discussion groups and meetings, from retreats and small meditation books during Advent and Lent, Christmas and Easter, from feast day celebrations to back to school nights (and the list can go on) is to help each of us grow in a personal relationship with Jesus with that keep us on a firm path that will end in Heaven.

If you look up the 'catechist prayer' from the US bishops' website, they also present an image of bundled poor or homeless family, out in the cold on a crisp night. The logo for catechists is: "Lord, when did we see you hungry" Matthew 25:37 The father, mother and small child all have golden halos behind their heads. Could they be the Holy Family?



We pray for catechists not simply to teach catechism, but to teach us how to act and respond to Jesus' call who one day will separate us if we fed the hungry, gave clothes to the naked, consoled those who grieve, welcomed the immigrant, visited the imprisoned. May the prayer above be for all in this parish, so that we will pass the final test and one day be welcomed into the banquet of heaven!
