




The parish will celebrate its 100<sup>th</sup> Jubilee in October 2025. There will be monthly events leading up to the Anniversary beginning January 2025.

#### A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Fall brings so many things that let us know a new season is upon us. It is getting darker earlier, and we will change the clocks in a couple of weeks. Anniversaries of our parish founding are steeped in remembering an earthquake that changed life in the Bay



Area thirty-five years ago and a fire that destroyed three thousand homes around us and caused at least three hundred of our parish families to move to other places.

In Rome, the second session of the Synod started at the beginning of the month. Check out the Vatican website for daily updates and reports as they meet. Please say a prayer each day for the whole Church to listen and act on the promptings of the Holy Spirit at this international meeting!

Our nation has begun the voting process, and I again encourage all who are eligible to get out and vote. This is a moral obligation the Church reminds us about. I have tried to encourage you to listen to the wisdom of the Church as we each decide who and what we will support. A few years ago, I put Cardinal McElroy's excellent article on what 'faithful citizenship' means in the mind of the Church. I have included a very brief article taken from the California Catholic Bishops' website (CACatholic.org) which has much more for your consideration.
