A Word From our Pastor

In November we celebrate the saints and the souls. We are all one day closer to when we will join one of those cohorts. Care later in life has been a political issue as we respond to recent election results and a few among us have had a very difficult time dealing with these issues



when tools to help our friends and family deal with them are not in place. I encourage all to prepare!

We do not know what the hour will come when the Lord will call us. Some preparations will honor our wishes and help those we expect to care for them. The following information this week and next charts out some of the issues we all must face. The Church is here to help, and several members of our parish would also help if asked. I can connect you individually if asked.

This is taken from the California government website but is a good start if you have not thought through or worked on these issues. It is an act of love for those you love if you have or do it now.

"We plan for the best life possible. Yet, all too often in this planning, we put off thinking about our final chapter of life and how to close that chapter as peacefully as possible and without crisis.

Consider this: Research shows that 70 percent of Americans would prefer to be at home with loved ones in their final days, yet only about 25 percent die at home. And, one of the most requested advice from legal aid is how to deal with end-of-life issues amidst a family crisis.

By planning for end-of-life care, many people may be able to avoid dying in unfamiliar institutional settings and can help their families avoid being impoverished by end-of-life care.

To help tackle planning for end-of-life care, please see the following checklists and resources. This material is informational only and not intended as legal advice. If you have questions, please consult with your doctor or a lawyer.

End-of-Life Care Checklist

 Gather Information For Decision-Making. Talk with your doctor, family, close friends, clergy and other trustworthy advisors about your health care wishes, questions and concerns.

- Prepare Your Advance Health Care Directive. After learning about your options and discussing your wishes, prepare an <u>advance health care directive</u>. Consider addressing <u>palliative care/pain management</u> and <u>hospice</u> <u>care</u> in your advance care directive.
- Prepare An Estate/Financial Plan. By developing an estate/ financial plan, you can avoid surprises and help protect the long-term health of your assets. While difficult to predict future needs, it would be useful to learn what kind of financial assistance you may be able to receive under your health insurance plan, disability insurance plan and Medicare. Address in advance your wishes for the oftentaboo subject of funeral arrangements. Information is available from the California Department of Consumer Affairs. Keep a personal copy of your estate/financial plan in a safe and accessible place, and give copies to your lawyer and other trusted people, so that others can refer to it when it is needed. Is there someone you trust who can/ should now be put onto bank accounts, insurance policies. stock investments? (Several of our fellow parishioners have run into great difficulties because this was not in place and a loved one's wishes are blocked and other family members suffer because of this.)
- Keep Information Safe And Accessible. Your best plans will
 not be any good unless both you and others can refer to
 them when they are needed. Keep a personal copy of your
 advance health care in a safe accessible place, and give
 copies to your doctor, lawyer and other trusted people.
 Keep your estate/financial plan in a safe and accessible
 place, and let your lawyer, executor or beneficiaries know
 where it is.

Advance Health Care Directives

An advance health care directive lets your doctor, family and friends know your health care preferences, including the types of special treatment you want or don't want at the end

of life and your desire for diagnostic testing, surgical procedures, cardiopulmonary resuscitation and organ donation.

By considering your options early, you can ensure the quality of life that is important to you and avoid having your family guess your wishes or make critical medical care decisions for you under stress or in emotional turmoil.
