A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Light and heat are two concerns we all have as the seasons change to winter and our clocks have now fallen back. I have adjusted the parking lot lights and but will continue to tweak it as the 'days grow shorter.' Please be careful when it is darker earlier.



We tried to put the heat on in the church, but our boiler expert quickly said there is a leak that keeps pressure from building up to provide the heat we want. This will be a complicated fix, so please dress warmly when coming on the cooler weekends and I will keep you apprised of the fix, the cost, and the progress we are making. Our expert has worked on similar systems and says this is old but worth fixing and keeping. He does not see a long period in getting it up and running again. Please pray and help us meet the cost when the monthly 'repair and maintenance collection' is taken up. Your ongoing generosity keeps up the site that is our spiritual home!

I am writing this on the feast of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, the first American citizen to be canonized a saint. She wanted to mission to China, but the pope told her to go to the United States to help the many Italian immigrants who were arriving with not the greatest welcome. She started off as a frail child, rejected from entering one group of religious sisters because of her frailty and went on to found sixty-seven hospitals, orphanages, and sites to help anyone in need. While she is my amazing advocate for helping me find parking in congested places, I ask all of us to invoke her intercession as we face immigration issues today in these United States. I concur with the pope, bishops, and others that as Catholics we must meet these issues always respecting our laws, but equally respecting the rights and human dignity of every human being. May Mother Cabrini help us!

As begun last week, I offer the following which none of us like dealing with, but which is a great act of love to those we love if we do deal with these matters:

Advance Health Care Directives Checklist

- Gather Information For Decision Making. Ask your doctor about your end-of-life health care treatment options. In addition, many organizations have information that may be useful.
- Discuss Your End-of-Life Decisions With Key People. Talk about your decisions with your family, doctor and others who are close to you. Some questions to consider for discussion:

- * What health situations do you anticipate may occur?
- * What abilities are so critical to your life that you can't imagine living without them?
- * Which is more important to you, the possibility of a longer life and the possibility of a better quality of life, and how much medical treatment you are willing to go through?
- * Are there specific medical treatments you want or do not want?
- * When you are dying, do you want to be in a nursing home, hospital or at home?
- * What do you want for <u>palliative care/pain management</u> and hospice care?
- * What other things do you want to make sure happens or does not happen, and what else do you want to make sure your loved ones and health care team know about your end -of-life health care preferences?
- Designate Someone To Carry Out Your Wishes. Decide who should handle your health care choices if you are unable to do so and discuss the matter with them. You can name a spouse, relative or other trusted person. Make sure they understand your health care preferences. Identify that person in your advance health care directive. You can also identify alternate designated people to handle your health care choices if your designated person is unable to do so.
- Prepare Your Advance Care Directive. Under state law, you have a legal right to express your health care wishes and to have them considered in situations when you are unable to make these decisions yourself. While state law requires certain provisions to appear in your health care directive, there is no required form to document your wishes. Probate Code section 4701. Many resources are available on how to prepare advanced health care directives, including sample forms and FAQs provided by health and hospice care providers.
- Inform Key People Of Your Preferences. Notify your doctor, family, and close friends about your end-of-life preferences. Keep a copy of your signed and completed advance health care directive safe and accessible. This will help ensure that your wishes will be known at the critical time and carried out. Give a copy of your form to:
- * The person you appoint as your designated agent to carry out your wishes, and to any alternate designated agents.
- * Your doctor and other health care providers
- * The health care institution that is providing your care
- * Trusted family members and other trusted, responsible people who are likely to be called if there is a medical emergency.
