

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A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

For the Jubilee, I want to acknowledge and celebrate that so many women in our parish have made contributions throughout these hundred years. We never would have fulfilled our mission in so many ways without the teachers and principals in our parish school, committee members serving on the Pastoral Councils, Parish Finances, School Boards, CYO boards,



Ladies Guild, ICF, Parents Club, WINGS, sacristans, choir members and the list goes on and on. Many parish staff members through these years have done above and beyond what was needed. Therefore, I think we should hear from some of them, and I am asking someone at least once a month to write in place of my weekly column.

Since she is just back from Rome, Lydia Deck offers these words:

"The Spirit is Moving...Adelante!

During Advent we contemplate peace, joy, love, and hope. Let me share how I find *hope!*

I am a member of a worldwide group called Discerning Deacons. Its vision includes embracing the prophetic call and ministry of deacons, providing witness to the historical and contemporary diaconal ministry of Catholic women, and trust in the Holy Spirit to guide discernment, thereby renewing the Church and healing the world.

In September, our St. Theresa's community celebrated St. Phoebe's Feast Day with a prayer service. Hundreds of Catholic faith communities around the world did likewise. At our prayer service, we blessed women in ministry and learned that St. Phoebe was a deacon in our early Church. St. Paul recognized Phoebe in Romans 16:

I commend to you our sister Phoebe, a deacon, of the church in Cencherae. I ask you to receive her in the Lord in a way worthy of these people and to give her any help she may need from you, for she has been the benefactor of many people, including me.

In October, members of Discerning Deacons and CEAMA (a group from the Amazonian Synod), representing 54 pilgrims from 5 countries, travelled to Rome. Our visit coincided with the meetings of the Second Synod. Our group included nuns, priests, theologians, lectors, chaplains, catechists, physicians, and social justice leaders. We traveled to Rome to reflect on women's ministries and give voice to women from every corner of the world.

Our pilgrimage included days of fervent prayer for our Church. We also attended the Global Synod Opening Mass in St. Peter's Square and prayed with (and over!) the Synod delegates.

We processed through Vatican Square singing and praying "Adsusmus Sancte Spiritus" — we stand before you, Holy Spirit. (Every session of the Synod begins with this prayer). We wore our baptismal whites and then, with banners and icons of St. Phoebe, we walked to the Church of San Lorenzo.

We held our own St. Phoebe prayer service which opened with a traditional cleansing rite. We were reminded to trust in the Holy Spirit. We invited the Holy Spirit to work within us and mold us into a people of grace. We sang "Receive her in the Lord" (as St. Paul said about St. Phoebe). We prayed the Litany of Deacons, asking the many Deacons of our Church history to pray for us. We recalled the graces of many journeys.

In the Church of San Lorenzo, my fellow pilgrims and I, along with some of the Synod delegates, prayed for women who are called to the diaconate ministry. Sister Laura Vicuna from CEAMA preached and reminded me of God's faithfulness.

Her words resonated with me and the other pilgrims:

The kingdom of God is accessible to everyone. We are all prophetic missionary disciples. This time of SYNOD is a unique moment in our Church history. The Spirit comes both as a gale as well as a gentle breeze.

Now is the time to walk together and be Church.

Whoever listens the Spirit becomes filled with the peace of the spirit.
God calls us in ways that we, as humans, understand.

We are vessels that carry a great treasure.

The Gospel calls us out of our comfort.

We can't take our eyes away from those who are marginalized.

Hope can never be taken from us.

The following days of our pilgrimage included many highlights:

We celebrated the Feast Day of St. Francis, calling to mind the spirit of Laudate Si.

We hosted an educational panel on Integral Ecology and The Ministry of Women and Synodality, featuring voices of indigenous women. We prayed a Rosary for Peace led by Pope Francis.

In retreat, we recalled the blessings, prophetic voices and little milagros (miracles) during our pilgrimage. A horizon-to-horizon rainbow followed me as I brought Father Bob's intentions for our St. Theresa community and our little scrolls from St. Theresa's Phoebe prayer service and offered them at St. Paul's Basilica.

Many women are called to the diaconate, but they are not able to answer their calling. They do good work and serve the marginalized but can neither answer the call through Orders nor receive sacramental grace to give them strength. Some would say that women are not able to "image Christ." We must remember that we are all baptized as priest, prophet, and king. You can imagine my emotion seeing the cover of our December issue of The Catholic Voice showing 7 men with the attached article reading "Our Bishop is calling forth men to discern a vocation to the diaconate."

Where is my hope? The Holy Spirit did fall like rain on the Synod Assembly. And I saw many hearts opened during the pilgrimage! Below is a paragraph from the document that was approved by the Synod assembly. Pope Francis has called on all world churches to accept and implement proposals from the final document:

By virtue of Baptism, women and men have equal dignity as members of the People of God. However, women continue to encounter obstacles in obtaining a fuller recognition of their charisms, vocation, and place in all the various areas of the Church's life. This is to the detriment of serving the Church's shared mission.

Scripture attests to the prominent role of many women in the history of salvation...It is important that the Scripture passages that relate these stories find adequate space inside liturgical lectionaries.

Crucial turning points in Church history confirm the essential contribution of women moved by the Spirit. Women make up the majority of churchgoers and are the first witnesses to the faith in families...They run schools, hospital, and shelters. They lead initiatives for reconciliation and promoting human dignity and social justice. Women contribute to theological research and are present in positions of responsibility in Church institutions, in diocesan cura and the Roman Curia. There are women who hold positions of authority and are leaders of the communities.

This Assembly asks for full implementation of all the opportunities already provided for in Canon Law with regard to the role of women, particularly in those places where they remain underutilized. There is no reason or impediment that should prevent women from carrying out leadership roles in the Church: what comes from the Holy Spirit cannot be stopped. Additionally, the question of women's access to the diaconal ministry remains open. The discernment needs to continue. The Assembly also asks that more attention be given to the language and images used in preaching, teaching, catechesis, and the drafting of official Church documents giving more space to the contributions of female saints, theologians, and mystics. "

I am reminded that by virtue of baptism women and men have dignity. I am reminded that the Sprit is moving among all the people of God. And during this time of Advent, we remember that the word became flesh by the grace of God and the Holy Spirit and a woman who said "Yes." Hope – no one can take it away from us.
