A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

This weekend we welcome back Archbishop Peter Chong of Fiji. Many of you remember when Fr. Peter lived at St. Theresa Rectory as he completed his doctoral studies at GTU.



Archbishop Peter's presence is another facet of our hundred-year history, and I know you will have time to personally greet him and hopefully celebrate Mass with him over the next couple of weeks. This weekend we are honored that he will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation in the parish. We congratulate the young women and men who will receive this sacrament and pray that the Holy Spirit will guide and bless the rest of their lives. We also look forward to seeing these young men and women continue in our parish taking on fully initiated roles and ministries that keep our parish vibrant.

With the feast of the Ascension celebrated this weekend and Pentecost right after it, I think a short presentation of the gifts of the Holy Spirit may renew all of us as we journey with the Lord along the way:

"The "gifts of the Holy Spirit" refer to specific graces or supernatural abilities given by God through the Holy Spirit to individuals, enabling them to serve God and others. These gifts are distinct from the <u>fruits of the Holy Spirit</u>, which are character traits formed within believers. There are several lists of gifts, with the most common being the seven traditionally identified in our Catholic tradition. Additionally, the New Testament lists various spiritual gifts for the benefit of the church.

These gifts are considered to be graces that perfect the virtues of those who receive them, enabling them to live a more holy life and to be more responsive to God's inspirations.

Wisdom: The ability to discern God's will in all areas of life and to make wise decisions.

Understanding: A deeper insight into the truths of faith, allowing for a more profound grasp of God's

revelation.

Counsel: The gift of knowing how to give good advice and make wise decisions for oneself and others.

Fortitude: The strength and courage to stand firm in faith, even in the face of adversity.

Knowledge: The ability to understand God's plan for the world and to live in a way that honors Him.

Piety: A deep respect and reverence for God, along with a love for prayer and worship.

Fear of the Lord: A reverence for God that leads to a life of obedience and humility.

Spiritual Gifts (New Testament):

The New Testament describes a variety of gifts, often listed in 1 Corinthians 12, Romans 12, and Ephesians 4, that are given to individuals for the benefit of the church.

These gifts include things like wisdom, knowledge, faith, healing, miracles, prophecy, discerning of spirits, speaking in tongues, and interpreting tongues.

Purpose of the Gifts:

The gifts of the Holy Spirit are given to equip believers to serve God, build up the church, and share the gospel with others.

Distinction from Fruits of the Spirit:

The gifts are distinct from the fruits of the Spirit, which are character traits that are the result of the Holy Spirit's indwelling in a believer's life. Fruits of the Spirit include love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. "

My prayer is that the gifts of the Holy Spirit will be generously poured out on our newly Confirmed and that each in their own way will enrich our parish and Church with the fruit they will produce. Again, thank you, Archbishop Peter, and congratulations to our Confirmandi!
