The chronic lack of opportunities for legal status for our immigrant brothers and sisters, together with the growing denial of due process to them, is injurious to human dignity and is a considerable factor in the breakdown of the rule of law. Likewise, unfounded accusations against Catholic service providers, who everyday endeavor to provide critical support and care to the most vulnerable, contribute to societal tensions and a growing climate of fear.

On behalf of my brother bishops, I want to assure all of those affected by actions which tear at the fabric of our communities of the solidarity of your pastors. As your shepherds, your fear echoes in our hearts and we make your pain our own. Count on the commitment of all of us to stand with you in this challenging hour.

I acknowledge those in our Catholic service and community organizations working to promote the common good by binding up the wounds of the afflicted. Let those motivated by the urgency of the current moment to work for just and humane solutions to these immigration challenges know of the cooperation and goodwill of the Catholic Bishops of our country."

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

I am aware that many of you went out and marched in many protests sparked by the lack of due process for individuals and a broken immigration policy in our nation. Several weeks ago, I stated that this problem should and



could be fixed and blame both political sides for preferring politics over fixing what is broken. Bishop Barber is at the Spring USCCB bishops meeting and he has sent to all the pastors the following comments that he encouraged be shared. (He also sent a detailed guide on how we are to act if enforcement shows up at our schools and parish which is happening in many parishes in California.)

The first comments are from the archbishop of Los Angeles and the second from the current president of the entire national bishops' conference. I present them because beyond joining a march I encourage you to contact federal and state legislators to get serious, act and fix these problems. This is a pro-life facet that is being trampled on, and it is fixable. I think only when many more call for this will it get the attention needed to fix it. As Archbishop Gomez states, "Other nations have a coherent immigration policy..." It is past time that we have one that will respect natural rights of all people.

June 6, 2025 "I am troubled by today's immigration enforcement raids in Los Angeles, and I am praying for our community. I pray tonight that everyone involved will exercise restraint and calm.

We all agree that we don't want undocumented immigrants who are known terrorists or violent criminals in our communities. But there is no need for the government to carry out enforcement actions in a way that provokes fear and anxiety among ordinary, hard-working immigrants and their families.

Again, I urge Congress to get serious about fixing our broken immigration system that leads so many to seek to cross our borders illegally.

Other nations have a coherent immigration policy that respects the natural rights of people to emigrate in search of a better life and also ensures control of their borders.

America should too. It's been almost 40 years since the last reform of our immigration laws. That's too long and it's time to do something about that.

May Our Lady of Guadalupe continue to watch over her children and pray for America."

Comments from Archbishop Broglio, speaking as President of the U.S. Conference of Bishops:

"Considering Pope Leo's message, no one can turn a deaf ear to the palpable cries of anxiety and fear heard in communities throughout the country in the wake of a surge in immigration enforcement actions. Law enforcement actions aimed at preserving order and ensuring community security are necessary for the common good. However, the current efforts go well beyond those with criminal histories. In the context of a gravely deficient immigration system, the mass arrest and removal of our neighbors, friends, and family members on the basis of immigration status alone, particularly in ways that are arbitrary or without due process, represent a profound social crisis before which no person of goodwill can remain silent. The situation is far from the communion of life and love to which this nation of immigrants should strive.

The many actions of protest throughout the country reflect the moral sentiments of many Americans that enforcement alone cannot be the solution to addressing our nation's immigration challenges. While protest and dissent can be a legitimate expression of democratic participation, violence is never acceptable. At the same time, it is good to remember Pope Francis' admonition that 'without equal opportunities the different forms of aggression and conflict will find a fertile terrain for growth and eventually explode' (Evangelii gaudium, 59).
