

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

I delayed in writing this last Wednesday so I could watch the press conference from Minnesota after the shooting in a Catholic parish where two children were killed, and many others were injured while attending



an opening of the school year Mass. I had intended to write something about labor and work as we mark another Labor Day weekend.

Shock, sadness, prayers, thoughts about how I would try to console a grieving community, a belief and desire that I can do more to prevent this from happening here and anywhere, especially in schools and places of worship have quickly changed that focus.

From the governor, mayor, chief of police, archbishop, and school principal, we heard words of consolation, support, faith, and the commitment as the school principal said several times: "never again!" He suggested we all make this part of our regular words when we discuss this and not just speak and pray about these matters but move and walk toward fixing what is broken. I wholeheartedly agree with him and encourage all of you to do the same.

For a number of years, the parish staff and council and school board have spoken about these security matters at St. Theresa's. Last year, both parish and school staffs worked diligently when both state and federal grants were advertised that would finance security upgrades around our school and parish property. Both the parish and school were allowed to apply.

The parish was awarded \$150K, but with recent pollical changes we were informed those monies we under review and may not be given to us or any of the other seven hundred entities in CA that were awarded grants.

Over the summer, a new electronic key system was installed in the school building and parish office building at quite an expensive investment not funded by any outside entity. Too many keys that open these buildings and some increase in unauthorized people

entering them during regular and sometimes during off hours made this an easy decision to implement.

The grants detailed many other security pieces such as security cameras, a different gate on the Mandalay entrance and many other ways that neither the school nor the parish can afford at this time, but we will continue to do what we can and hope we are never in a position where we suddenly have to do something.

It is very difficult to close our campus to outsiders with the gate behind the church and on Mandalay and Clarewood roads. Every day we witness neighbors walking their dogs and as many of you know begin those first times behind the wheel of a car on the path to getting a license.

So, what can we do now? Please remember what you hear at airports, train stations, just along a city street: "If you see something, do something." A few years ago, a group of school parents quietly on their own decided to sit in the back or near the side doors, so they could alert action quickly, if something looked amiss.

Certainly, pray for the whole parish community in Minnesota, for their healing and the lifelong pain they will carry. Pray, for all the victims of these situations and as the principal of Annunciation school stated so clearly: "Put into your regular words: never again and then move, use your feet to get something changed."

Like I wrote about a few weeks ago about the whole immigration situation, it and this tragedy can be fixed, but we each have to work for that to happen and prayer is not enough. God hears all our prayers. In the recent daily scriptures, we are assured that God even knows what we need before we even ask, but God has blessed us with free will, amazing brains, and the wisdom to figure it out for the good or in these cases for the bad.

I will be writing again to politicians voicing my thoughts. I will speak up at gatherings and interject when falsehoods are being espoused as fact. I will continue to pray for all of the above and pray that no other parent will have to bear what many are experiencing in a parish not so far away from us.
