St. Theresa Church 100th Jubilee Celebration




The parish is celebrating its 100th Jubilee. There are monthly events leading up to the Anniversary.




NOVEMBER 1 & 2: ALL SOULS

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Prayer works! Jesus promised God would hear us and our ongoing dialogue with God as we walk by faith continues to support and encourage us every day of our lives.



This was the hallmark of her teaching from our patron, St. Theresa, the Little Flower, and the assurances we garner from the writings of St. Theresa of Avila whose feast we celebrated this past week.

Our patron trusted even when she didn't get what she prayed for right away or at all. She wanted to receive Holy Communion at a much younger age than she was permitted, she wanted to go on a missionary journey and be vulnerable to martyrdom and she prayed to be admitted to the Carmelite convent before any authority would allow her. Yet, she persevered and would proclaim that God had answered all of her prayers.

Many stories abound about St. Theresa of Avila, but you have heard me tell the story of her rushing to do some good on a terrible rainy day. Her carriage tips over and Theresa is thrown into a large mud puddle. She climbs out, raises her prayer to God, and is said to say: "If this is the way you treat your friends, no wonder you have so few of them!"

A few years after my Mom's death, the wonderful caregiver who had been with her for almost twelve years was working with another woman who was growing very ill. She told the woman that she would contact me, asking that I pray for her. The woman replied that she should not bother. Lourdes was shocked at this reaction and asked the woman who was a Catholic why she responded that way.

The woman told her: "I'm sure he prayed for his mother's health, and she died, why would God listen to his prayers now for someone he doesn't know?"

As I said above, prayer works and we should all continue to pray and believe that God hears all of us and all our prayers, but we also have to pray with faith that what we think should happen will not always be the outcome. We need to trust in God's mercy and love and believe God will always love us and answer our prayers in a good and loving manner, but it will not always or often be how we would chart out things when we present our prayers.

Pope Leo asked us to say a rosary every day in October for peace in Gaza and Ukraine. We are grateful for the fragile peace that seems to be taking hold in Gaza and Israel and the whole Middle East. I encourage all to keep this prayer going and trust that God will ultimately bring peace to this region and the whole world.

As Halloween decorations pop up all around us and the colors seem to compete with Christmas and Easter (there are spring-colored pumpkins on a lawn near the parish site, green, red, purple, etc.), we remember that Halloween is All Hallows Eve or the night before All Saints Day. Let us pray to all of our favorite saints who are examples of faith and prayer. Let us send pictures of St. Theresa parishioners who have died for our All Souls' hundred celebration and remembrance. May our hope and faith fortify us so that one day we will fully discover how God answered all of our prayers and always responded to us with love!
