

St. Theresa Church 100th Jubilee Celebration




The parish is celebrating its 100th Jubilee. There are monthly events leading up to the Anniversary.

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Welcome Bishop Michael Barber! He joins us on Sunday to celebrate the one hundred anniversary of St. Theresa Parish. Recently, when a large reliquary was brought to Christ the Light Cathedral, Bishop Barber preached



and showed his own personal devotion to our patron, St. Theresa of the Child Jesus.

If you were not at the Mass at the Cathedral that day, I strongly recommend you read his words that can be found on the diocesan and cathedral website https://www.oakdiocese.org/bishop-barber-the-appeal-of-the-relics-of-saint-therese/. They will inspire you as we continue to rejoice in our patron.

Bishop Barber is the latest of eight bishops that have been our parish's bishop since it's creation one hundred years ago. I can assure all that each of them had a devotion and friendship with St. Theresa. Her words, example and intercession inspire our bishops, and I hope all of us. I add a footnote to our history that there have only been six pastors during those same hundred years.

This past week we celebrated the feast of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini. She is the first American citizen to be canonized a saint. She wanted to be a missionary to Asia, like our own St. Theresa, but Pope Leo XIII sent her to minister to the Italian immigrants who were in America. These immigrants were treated poorly by the Irish clergy and our government like so many other immigrants who sought refuge, sustenance, safety from coercion and so many other reasons that caused them to leave family and friends forever.

Mother Cabrini was afraid of the ocean, but in her lifetime crossed the Atlantic, twenty four times. As an Italian woman she was subject to all sorts of roadblocks from the Church here and our government and local people who thought Italians were inferior. How lucky we are that the opposition did not thwart or succeed in her efforts, and she is credited with establishing sixty seven schools, orphanages, and social institutions to

assist these maligned people. Say a prayer in thanksgiving the next time you enjoy your favorite Italian restaurant or pizza!

Unfortunately, even in this day, there are some who vilify the immigrant and treat a fellow human being, made in God's image and likeness harshly and at times sinfully.

The United States conference of bishops which comprises of all the American bishops has released a letter strongly criticizing such policies that are contrary to our Church's beliefs and the words of Jesus who commanded us to 'love one another.' I encourage you to read it and perhaps thank our own bishop that they had the courage to produce this. Happy anniversary to all and I close with the opening prayer for Mass on Thursday: God our Father, who called Saint Frances Xavier Cabrini from Italy to serve the immigrants of America, by her example teach us to have concern for the stranger, the sick and all those in need, and by her prayers help us to see Christ in all the men and women we meet. Through our Lord Jesus Christ.
