A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

The Catholic Youth Organization (commonly known as CYO) was founded in part to provide good, safe sports (from track, volleyball, basketball, and many other sports) for our Catholic children. You don't have to go to a Catholic school to participate but any child in most any parish was eligible to join a team. Moms and Dads have stepped forward to coach and keep the programs on track.

One major component besides providing fun, the teaching of sport skills and learning how to be part of a team was the lessons that everyone is to be respected and you don't always win. Thank God for the skill to win and accept the defeat and know there will be a next time.

We called it *Christian sportsmanship*. Winning is not everything and one wins when you follow the rules and accept defeat when the competition does better in a race or game. This is not the ethic practiced in some other sports programs, but it is part of our overall Catholic way of life.

Teaching the children during good exercise and fun these core values is a stated mission of CYO.

I mention this considering the recent horrible situation we saw at the U. S. Capitol and I pray that by the time you read this, no other disturbances or acts of terrorists have occurred.

I affirm this as part of my teaching authority as pastor and say it even the Catholic priests or a so-called Catholic TV station say something different. They are wrong if they teach anything less and I would be happy to demonstrate the error with the teachings of Jesus, affirmed by Church teaching through the ages and most recently in the Catechism. In the week that is past by the time you read this; I have written to several bishops to make this claim when they are in error.

Pope Francis reacting to what happened at the weekly Sunday Angelus blessing said the following to the American people:

"I send an affectionate greeting to the people of the United States of America, shaken by the recent assault on the Congress. I pray for all those who've

lost their lives – five – lost in those dramatic moments. Let me reiterate that violence is always self-destructive. Nothing is healed by violence and so much is lost. I exhort the civil authorities and the entire population to keep a high sense of responsibility, to the end of calming spirits, promoting national reconciliation, and promoting democratic values rooted in American society. May the Immaculate Virgin, Patroness of the United States, help keep alive the culture of encounter, the culture of care, as the guiding path to building the common good together, and may it be done with all those who live in that land."



I pray with the Holy Father for peace in our country and for reconciliation so we can better work for promoting democratic values for all in our nation. I am keenly aware that several executions may have taken place during the past week by the current administration which is now fully illuminated as not being pro-life.

This week we will inaugurate a new president. No matter who you voted for, I exhort you like the lessons hopefully learned in CYO or other Catholic education that you had to pray for him and his success. His success is our success is what another Catholic, Arnold Schwarzenegger said in an impassioned address also last Sunday. (Google it if you haven't seen it). May God bless, protect, and guide our new president and vice-president. May they lead us to healing as a nation and may all who hate, or who would revert to violence have transformed and changed hearts by Gods power and mercy.

As we continue to live in a pandemic, I know that January 22 brings together in many places a 'March for Life'. I pray for those in our parish who will participate in the form it may take this year because of the pandemic. I am committed to life and believe as a parish we might look at again the complete meaning of our 'life' beliefs for the sake of every person from the moment of conception to a natural death after a long, full life.

ST. THERESA SCHOOL**A Day in the Life of a Kindergartener at St. Theresa**

A day in the life of a kindergartener this year may look different than years past, but we have found creative and exciting ways to stay engaged and be happy learners. We welcomed our first group of students to in-person learning in November and our next group of students will join us this month. We are currently using a hybrid model of learning where some students are learning in the classroom while other students are learning online.

Each morning the kinders come to school wearing their masks and mermaid or animal themed shield. Once our class has arrived, we all hold a colored knot on a 50 ft rope and walk to our classroom. Each student sits down at their desk and has their own learning basket filled with their school books and supplies. While the students in-person are settling in for their day, the students at home join our class online. We have a TV monitor that shows the students learning virtually so that the students inside the classroom can see them as well. We begin each day as a whole class and join the student leadership in prayer, pledge and school announcements. Our day is filled with whole class lessons, small groups, reading groups and asynchronous activities (activities students complete independently). Each day they also have a specialty class where they participate in Spanish, Music, PE and Art. In order to break up our day, we will play music, dance and play fun videos that get us up and moving.

All of our kindergarteners have recess and lunch each day. The students who are learning virtually take a break from the computer and have their play time and lunch at home. The students who are in-person play and eat socially distanced in the designated kindergarten eating area. They bring toys from home that they can play with during recess and we have come up with some fun, safe games for them to play where they can engage each other. After lunch and recess, we gather as a class one last time before dismissal. Despite the challenges of this year, we have come together as a class and as a community and we are looking forward to hopefully being together as a whole class soon.






EVERY HOUR OF EVERY DAY


In today's Gospel we see Jesus calling his first disciples.
