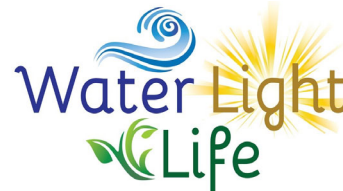
MASK MANDATE UPDATE

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

I hope all will pray for and support the many candidates for the Sacraments. Last weekend, we acknowledged and welcomed several among us who will be baptized or welcomed into full communion with the Church. The week before, all the second graders and a few others were blessed as they approach making their First Communion in May. Two Sundays ago, the Confirmation class burned the palms you brought as part of their preparation to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation in May and help us celebrate Ash Wednesday in a few weeks.

Deacon Eddie is back with us after a longer winter break due to the pandemic racing around the Jesuit community. His presence is part of his preparation to be ordained for service in the Church as a priest.

Several are facing challenging medical conditions and are always welcome to ask for the Sacrament of the Sick after Mass or by calling the parish office or the emergency phone line if it is a sudden emergency.

All of the above are signs of the Lord continuing to work in our parish community and reminders of our own journey with the Lord from the moment of conception when as the psalmist says, the Lord knew us in our mother's womb and throughout our lives and to the day the Lord will call us to heaven.

All of the above and the care we show one another with our encouragement, prayers, quiet service, and presence at the weekly liturgies fortify us as the beloved Body of Christ.

With that in mind you have been hearing a lot about the Synod that the Holy Father has called for which is to involve as many of the billion Catholics throughout the world as possible. I again, ask you to say a prayer for this process each day until it is complete. I again invite you to participate in one of the listening sessions the

parish and other groups are sponsoring. I invite you to invite someone you may know who has walked away from the Church or feels very alienated from it. I invite you to converse with members of other ecclesial communities separated from union with us.



Pope Francis has been inspired to lead us along this path just as his predecessor, good Pope (Saint) John XXIII was inspired to convene the Second Vatican Council. Please also pray for some who opposed to the whole process and have not shown respect or charity to the Holy Father and all who participate in this process.

This past week the everchanging guidelines regarding the pandemic took new directions. We all pray this will be a solid and final road to getting back to not having to wear masks, etc. The diocese issued new guidelines effective February 16, 2022, that individuals who are vaccinated are not required to wear a mask indoors. Anyone who is unvaccinated must continue to wear a mask indoors. These guidelines apply to the parish not the school. I want to assure all who wish to still wear a mask that they will be respected in our community.

I recently had a conversation with someone who told me he has been wearing a mask when he travels by plane for many years before this current need. He said he observed several people especially as he travelled for business to Asia, wearing masks. As the rules ease up, let us respect those who would continue with this practice for various reasons.

Please come to the annual School Auction! March 13 at the Sequoyah Country Club promises to be a wonderful way to support the parish school and reconnect and connect with our community. The pandemic has kept us apart for a long time.

SYNOD

Our Holy Father Pope Francis has invited the Catholic Church to embark on a journey together. Through listening and discernment rooted in the Holy Spirit, the entire people of God will be called to contribute to a process by which the Church deepens in understanding of Her mission and looks toward the future.

The parish will have two listening sessions.

Tuesday, March 1 at 7:00 pm in the church
Thursday, March 3 at 7:00 pm on Zoom

Our Synod process will gather groups from our parishes, schools and Catholic organizations to prayerfully discern and explore our relationship with our church and our Lord Jesus Christ. After these listening sessions, responses will be collected, presented to Bishop Barber and sent to the Vatican. The final process will culminate in a gathering of bishops from throughout the world in 2023.

In responding to this question, we are invited to:

- Recall our experiences: What experiences of our local Church does this question call to mind?
- Re-read these experiences in greater depth: What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited?
- Gather the fruits to share: Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy Spirit resound? What is the Spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? Where do we register a consensus? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

Listening Session Questions

- How is “journeying together” happening in your local church or group, in carrying out the Church’s mission?
- What are the joys in carrying out journeying together? What helps or hinders us in this?
- What new paths is the Holy Spirit leading us to discern to grow in our journey together?
- How is the Holy Spirit inviting us to proclaim the message of Jesus Christ in today’s world?

In responding to these questions, it is helpful to remember that “journeying together” occurs in two deeply interconnected ways. First, we journey together with one another as the People of God. Next, we journey together as the People of God with the entire human family. These two perspectives enrich one another and are helpful for our common discernment towards deeper communion and more fruitful mission.


Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

CATHOLIC CORNER

THE CHAIR OF PETER

February 22 we celebrate a feast with an unusual name, The Chair of Saint Peter the Apostle.

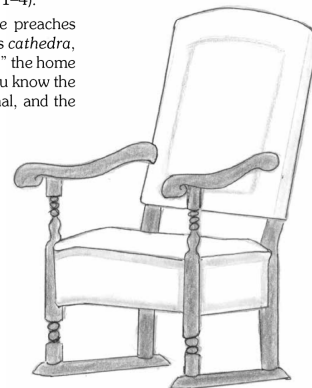
But we are not really celebrating a piece of furniture; we are honoring what the chair symbolizes. The chair itself does have a history. St. Peter is often considered the first Bishop of Rome. Today the pope is regarded as the Bishop of Rome. The physical Chair of Peter is in the basilica of St. Peter in Rome. Some of the wood in the chair is believed to be preserved from the time when Peter himself sat in it. You can see a picture of this chair, now beautifully decorated, on the Internet.

The significance of this feast is not the chair itself but what it symbolizes. A person who holds a position of authority and leadership in an organization is often referred to as its chair. The person who sits in the leadership chair holds great responsibility. In Matthew's Gospel (16:13-19) we read that Jesus told Peter that he would build his church upon Peter and give him the "keys to the kingdom of heaven." Every pope since Peter has had the responsibility to continue to lead the Church in the footsteps of Christ. The pope is to care for all people, following the example of Jesus the Good Shepherd (see 1 Peter 5:1-4).

Every bishop has a chair from which he preaches and presides. The Latin word for this chair is *cathedra*, from which we derive the English "cathedral," the home church of the bishop of each diocese. Do you know the name of your bishop, archbishop, or cardinal, and the name of your cathedral?

If your cathedral is nearby you might want to visit it and see its *cathedra*. Say a prayer for your bishop, who tries every day to do the work given to him by Jesus. If you can't visit the cathedral try to find a picture of it on its website.

In your own parish, notice the presider's chair where the priest sits during the liturgy. Compare it to the picture of the bishop's chair at your cathedral.
