## A SYNOPSIS OF MY VOCATION STORY: FR. NGEMA W. ENOW

On the occasion of the 10th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood, I am delighted to share with you, beloved parishioners of St Theresa's Church, Oakland, the story of my journey to the priesthood. I could never have imagined that it would be in this community that I will be marking this significant event. Contemplating this fact, I cannot thank God enough, and you too dear people of God.

Sandwiched somewhere between fascination for the army and the lure of politics, laid this mysterious attraction to the priesthood, deep in my heart. The attraction initially manifested itself in little ways such as, first, obsession with mimicking priests and, later, overwhelming zeal for serving at Mass. It, however, took the intervention of some holy souls in my parish community for me to begin considering the possibility of a call to the priesthood.

Once that happened, in 1993 I expressed the wish to study in the Minor Seminary. But the desire did not initially materialize. I suspect that my Dad (RIP) frustrated this move at the time because he had cold feet about it. Things turned around, however, five years later. After my secondary education, the same Dad of mine enthusiastically probed me to secure a place in my dream Bishop Rogan College, Soppo, the minor seminary where I completed the last two years of my pre-university studies in June 2000.

It was only logical, then, for me to apply to proceed to the Major Seminary. But this logic was not shared by many of my nearest and dearest who somehow felt I had gone insane. I heard this jibe, "you must be mad," from so many lips that I eventually started wondering if all was truly well with me. Thank God, my Dad had become an enthusiastic supporter of my vocation to the priesthood. On the part of my Mum, I could discern carefully concealed dissent and pain, understandably because she was not yet a Catholic.

The Catholic faith was pretty young then in my Nguti locality where the Immaculate Conception Parish had been established in 1987. Before that time the closest Catholic parish to us was some 62 miles away. No one from my locality had become a priest; none had even a partial major seminary experience. But my zeal for the priesthood was simply unstoppable.

I began the journey in September 2000 as a candidate for the Diocese of Mamfe (my home diocese created in 1999). All went well until the end of the seventh year of my studies for the priesthood. In June 2007, I suffered from what I now describe as a spiritual blackout. My mind was suddenly invaded by myriads of expressible and inexpressible questions about God, the Church, and the priesthood. I could not quite understand myself anymore.

When I returned to St Thomas Aquinas' Major Seminary, Bambui, in September 2007, I was expected to submit my application for ordination to the diaconate like the rest of my classmates. I could not. I did not. Though visibly taken aback, the seminary authorities were very kind and understanding. My formators did their best to dissuade me from quitting the seminary. They further succeeded to counsel me to return the next academic year to complete the program of studies even though I was not on the path to ordination.



In that final academic year, I was offered the opportunity to attend the International Congress for Seminarians in Rome organized by the Focolare Movement in January 2009. The package included a prior one month experience at the Vinea Mea Spiritual Centre in Loppiano, near Florence, Italy. The high point of this experience was my moment of prayer at the Tomb of St Peter. I asked God for clarity, but none came, or so it seemed to me.

Therefore, upon returning to Cameroon, I formally notified the Bishop of my decision to withdraw. The good Bishop Francis T. Lysinge paid a visit to our seminary and had a long talk with me. He resolved to spend two nights in the seminary to give me the last chance to rethink my decision. When we eventually met on the third day, I reaffirmed my stance and he served me my letter of disengagement.

News of that development was a bitter pill for the people of Nguti who had become thrilled at the prospects of having their first priest. Jibes could once again be heard – this time around mostly in whispers: "he must be mad!"

So how did I eventually find myself in the priesthood? Well, the candid and complete answer is that I do not know. Things just happened in a way that is humanly not easy to explain. I think the Vinea Mea experience yielded dividends and the prayer at St Peter's tomb got answered after all, well beyond my imagination. God was not done with me yet. He kept visiting me through many people and many occasions of deep prayer and reflection that eventually turned things around for me. One of the high points, in retrospect, was a meeting arranged for me with the then Bishop of Buea, Immanuel Bushu, by one of my ex-formators.

I only got to know how personally interested this bishop had become in my case the day he gave me the surprise of my life. It was a rainy August afternoon. I was all alone in my room, thinking about everything and nothing at the

same time, when I got a summon from Bishop Bushu. He was in my home town Nguti and wanted to meet with me at the Rectory! When we met, he told me he had come for me and asked his driver to accompany me home as my mover. Once in Buea, he hosted me in his house for two weeks at the end of which he assigned me to the Saints Peter and Paul University Church in Buea. It was while there that I got ordained as a deacon on June 29, 2010 and as a priest on February 17, 2011 for the Diocese of Buea out of which the Diocese of Mamfe had been carved.

As I look back ten years after my priestly ordination, I cannot thank God enough for his patience with my human obstinacy. Though painfully aware of my many ministerial blunders and personal failures in discipleship all these years, I am simply marveled at the marvels God has done through my one decade of priestly ministry. I have been something of an itinerant priest who is moved to a different location with new or additional assignments each year. I have always had to double or triple and even quadruple challenging functions at the local and national levels. I am particularly struck at how richly God has blessed my life and how greatly he has enriched my priestly ministry through the amazing people he places on my path. Someday, I hope to find the motivation to write a book on the fulfillment of Mark 10:29-30 in my priestly ministry.

I sincerely think that God could have made no better arrangement for me at this phase of my vocation journey than place me in the warmth of this welcoming faith community of St Theresa's Church. For the multifaceted welcome and the love, and the care and concern that the Pastor and Parishioners daily and variously shower on me, I remain immensely grateful.


