

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

I write this for the last bulletin that will be printed for us and many, many parishes across the U.S. by the J.S. Paluch Company since 1913. We are grateful for their services and for all the sponsors whose ads you have seen on our weekly bulletin for many years. If you have any direct contact with these sponsors, please thank them for the support they have given to our parish for many years.

The parish staff began to think this might be coming a few weeks ago, but we believed we would lose this relationship with Paluch in September when the current contract with them expired. It was a surprise when we received notice this past week that this would occur now. The staff (especially Cathy, who has done a wonderful job with the weekly Friday Flocknote) began to prepare. For the time being, a four page printed bulletin will be available each week that we will prepare and print ourselves and we ask that only those who do not receive the Friday Flocknote take a copy. However, I invite all to consider signing up for the Friday Flocknote which will contain more than what will be printed in the bulletin going forward. In fact, several hundred already use the Friday Flocknote every week and we have greatly reduced the number of paper bulletins needed. It is easy to sign up for it and instructions can be found on our parish website and the bulletin.

As we begin the great season of Lent, some always ask for the rules for fasting and abstinence. Here is a good summary of these practices that I hope will help all of us have a good Lent where we grow closer to the Lord.

"Prior to 1966, the Roman Catholic Church allowed Catholics of fasting age to eat only one full meal a day throughout all forty days of Lent, except on the Lord's Day (Sundays). In addition, Catholics were allowed to take a smaller meal, called a collation (which was introduced after the 14th century A.D.), and a cup of some beverage, accompanied by a little bread, in the morning. The 1917 Code of Canon Law allowed the full meal on a fasting day to be taken at any hour and to be supplemented by two collations, with the quantity and the quality of the food to be determined by local custom. Abstinence from meat was to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on Fridays and Saturdays in Lent. The Lenten fast ended on Holy Saturday at noon. Only those aged 21 to 59 were obliged to fast. As with all ecclesiastical laws, particular difficulties, such as strenuous work or illness, excused one from observance, and a dispensation from the law could be granted by a bishop or parish priest. A rule of thumb is that the two collations should not add up to the equivalent of another full meal. Rather portions were to be: "sufficient to sustain strength, but not sufficient to satisfy hunger."

In 1966, Pope Paul VI reduced the obligatory fasting days from all forty days of Lent to Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, abstinence days to Fridays and Ash Wednesday, and allowed episcopal conferences to replace abstinence and fasting with other forms of penitence such as charity and piety, as declared and established in his apostolic constitution *Paenitemini*; fasting on all forty days of Lent is still "strongly recommended". This was done so that those in countries where the standard of living is lower can replace fasting with prayer, but "...where economic well-being is greater, so much more will the witness of asceticism have to be given..." This was made part of the 1983 Code of Canon Law, which made obligatory fasting for those aged between 18 and 59, and abstinence for those aged 14 and upward. The Irish Catholic Bishops' Conference decided to allow other forms of Friday penance to replace that of abstinence from meat, whether in Lent or outside Lent, suggesting alternatives such as abstaining from some other food, or from alcohol or smoking; making a special effort at participating in family prayer or in Mass; making the Stations of the Cross; or helping the poor, sick, old, or lonely. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has maintained the rule of abstention from meat on Friday only during Lent and considers poultry to be a type of meat but not fish or shellfish.



What is important is that whatever we do in Lent it should be something that brings us closer to God and closer to being a good disciple. Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving offers thousands of opportunities for the next forty days. I hope you will be available to participate in the parish Lenten retreat. Fr. Ngema is offering a Bible Study on Zoom once again and has received high praise each year he has done this. More people often come to daily Mass (8:30am, Monday-Friday) since the Lenten readings are so powerful in reminding us of Jesus' love to save us.

Some minor changes begin on Ash Wednesday when celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation (more about this in future weeks.) We haven't restarted the Lenten soup nights this year, but families and groups of families can easily do this on their own with some communal prayer. I hope all of these things will be fruitful for our spiritual lives! Have a happy Lent and let me know if I can help.

Special thanks to the five dads and one second grader who cleaned up the garden area last weekend. It is ready for the children to plant this year's crop! Congratulations to all who made the annual School Auction a great event. Finally we are using the Event Center in the many ways it was built for, I know many are grateful for the support of this year's event and more will be presented about this in future bulletins.

**Fast & Abstinence**

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

The law of fasting allows one full meal and two smaller ones.

The law of abstinence prohibits the eating of meat. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.

The obligation of abstinence begins at age 14. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE (SJC) CORNER

"Our relationship with the environment can never be isolated from our relationship with others and with God" — Pope Francis, *Laudato Si*, 119

In 2015, Pope Francis released his encyclical letter, "Laudato Si': On Care for Our Common Home", the first-ever papal encyclical devoted to the global environmental crisis. Inspired by his namesake, St. Francis of Assisi and his deep communion with all Creation, the Pope issued a powerful appeal to the Church and "all people of good will" to urgently come together and respond to "the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor."

In preparation for this year's Earth Day, April 22nd, the SJC will be hosting an in-person viewing of the film, *The Letter: A Message for Our Earth*. This moving 80-minute film is inspired by Pope Francis' encyclical letter, and tells the story of a journey to Rome of frontline leaders from around the world to discuss the letter, leaders who have directly experienced the ecological crisis and are doing something about it. The exclusive dialogue also reveals insight into the Pope's personal history and stories never seen since he became the Bishop of Rome.

CATHOLIC CORNER

ADAM AND EVE


You may be familiar with the Gospel stories of Lent. Each year on the First Sunday of Lent we accompany Jesus into the desert, where he is tempted by Satan. On the second Sunday, in the account of the Transfiguration, Jesus is revealed in his glory before his passion. The stories of the woman at the well, the healing of the man born blind, and the raising of Lazarus prepare us for the baptisms of the Easter Vigil with images of water, light, and new life. This year, let's take a closer look at the first readings, which give us some of our family history from the Old Testament. We will hear parts of these stories again at the Easter Vigil.

We begin with Adam and Eve in the second creation story (Genesis 2:7-9). Unlike Genesis 1, which describes the "days" of creation, this version tells us how God formed Adam from *adama*, the Hebrew word for ground, and created Eve, "the mother of all the living" (Genesis 3:20), to be his partner. God then placed them in a garden that had everything they needed, but they disobeyed God and had to leave paradise. God did not abandon them, but promised to send someone to save them and bring them back into friendship with God. That someone is Jesus.



At the Easter Vigil we will hear the story of creation to remind us that God loves us and gives us all we need. Complete this picture of a tree and make a beautiful garden of fruits and flowers around it. Draw Adam and Eve in the garden. Say a prayer thanking God for creating the world and all the people in it.
