

Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting allows one full meal and two smaller ones.

The law of abstinence prohibits the eating of meat. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.

The obligation of abstinence begins at age 14. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

Water, Light, and Life: A Lenten Parish Mission

Lent is 1 week away, and we are preparing to offer a parish retreat. During the Lenten season, the parish community, along with the whole Church, focuses its attention on the paschal mystery of Christ in a special way. It is a season of conversion and renewal. During these forty days, all members of the community, through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, ready themselves to renew their baptismal promises at the Easter Vigil.

As a way to enter more deeply into Lent and prepare for Easter, our parish will be offering a four-session Lenten retreat called *Water, Light, and Life*. During this parish retreat, we will explore Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman and the man born blind, as well as the miracle of raising his friend Lazarus from the dead.

This gathering is an opportunity for conversion, prayer, reflection, and faith-sharing for you. Mark your calendars and come join us! Please contact the parish office if you have questions.



BIBLICAL LESSONS ON PRAYER

SYNOD

Our Holy Father Pope Francis has invited the Catholic Church to embark on a journey together. Through listening and discernment rooted in the Holy Spirit, the entire people of God will be called to contribute to a process by which the Church deepens in understanding of Her mission and looks toward the future.

THE PARISH WILL HOLD TWO LISTENING SESSIONS
Tuesday, March 1 at 7:00 pm in the church
Thursday, March 3 at 7:00 pm on Zoom

Our Synod process will gather groups from our parishes, schools and Catholic organizations to prayerfully discern and explore our relationship with our church and our Lord Jesus Christ. After these listening sessions, responses will be collected, presented to Bishop Barber and sent to the Vatican. The final process will culminate in a gathering of bishops from throughout the world in 2023.

In responding to this question, we are invited to:

- Recall our experiences: What experiences of our local Church does this question call to mind?
- Re-read these experiences in greater depth: What joys did they bring? What difficulties and obstacles have they encountered? What wounds did they reveal? What insights have they elicited?
- Gather the fruits to share: Where in these experiences does the voice of the Holy Spirit resound? What is the Spirit asking of us? What are the points to be confirmed, the prospects for change, the steps to be taken? Where do we register a consensus? What paths are opening up for our local Church?

Listening Session Questions

- How is “journeying together” happening in your local church or group, in carrying out the Church’s mission?
- What are the joys in carrying out journeying together? What helps or hinders us in this?
- What new paths is the Holy Spirit leading us to discern to grow in our journey together?
- How is the Holy Spirit inviting us to proclaim the message of Jesus Christ in today’s world?

In responding to these questions, it is helpful to remember that “journeying together” occurs in two deeply interconnected ways. First, we journey together with one another as the People of God. Next, we journey together as the People of God with the entire human family. These two perspectives enrich one another and are helpful for our common discernment towards deeper communion and more fruitful mission.






God's Word for Children


One has been written in to give you a start.

Follow the directions under each tree.





THE SANCTUARY LAMP


When Jesus ascended to heaven, he assured his followers, "I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). One way that Jesus remains with us is in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We share in Christ's Body and Blood when we receive Communion. When Mass is concluded, Jesus' real presence in the consecrated host is reserved in the tabernacle. ("Reserved" means "set aside for a particular purpose or person.") Ministers of care often take Communion from the tabernacle to homebound, sick, and dying parishioners. The tabernacle is usually beautifully decorated and kept locked to show our love and respect for the Eucharist.

People also come to the tabernacle to pray and worship Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. They can do this as part of formal prayer at a Holy Hour, or they can make a visit to the church and pray silently before the tabernacle.



This real presence of Christ is indicated by a sanctuary lamp. The sanctuary is the area usually set apart from the rest of the church. It includes the altar, pulpit, and chair for the priest. The sanctuary lamp is usually placed on or hanging near the tabernacle. The candle in the lamp is always kept burning to remind us that Jesus is present.

Make a visit to your parish church and look for the tabernacle and sanctuary lamp. When you find them, kneel quietly in a pew and say a prayer thanking Jesus for being with us always. When you return home, draw a picture of the lamp and tabernacle.
