## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR *CONTINUED*

Welcome Back! To some who have begun to come to Mass on weekdays and on Sunday, we have missed you! We are happy we are starting to be able to worship together and we pray since this is the third time, we got to this point that our worship will remain open with the number allowed ever increasing.

We have celebrated Ash Wednesday, a day rich in associations and symbolism. It marks the beginning a Lent, a time for turning again to the practice of our faith, in prayer, self-denial (fasting) and practical generosity (almsgiving). Ash Wednesday is the doorway into this season of renewal. Even though it was quite different this year due to the pandemic, it still gives all another opportunity to grow closer to the Lord.

This year, following guidelines from the Vatican, ashes were sprinkled over our heads. This has been the more traditional way for hundreds of years, though probably the first time in our lifetime. Ashes mark our turning again to God, seeking his mercy, forgiveness, and help. We use these words: 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return'. Yes, we cannot pretend otherwise. Or: 'Repent and believe in the Gospel'. Yes, we seek the one thing that is necessary: the grace of God.

An important point about receiving ashes is that it is an outward sign of an inner step, a movement of the heart towards our Lord. And we don't need ashes to do this. This year I invite you to concentrate much more on this inner, spiritual movement than on its outward manifestation as in the imposition of ashes.

If you did not receive ashes this year, celebrate Lent at home, with your family, in the household or 'support bubble' of which you are a part. Gather for a while. Read the prayer that follows or read a scripture passage. Bless each other by making the sign of the cross on each other's forehead. Spend some time praying in a way that

you know. Make this a prayer of your heart for God's mercy upon this world struggling to cope with the terrible pandemic and the devastation it is bringing.



*Here is a prayer sent out to his diocese composed by Cardinal Nichols of Westminster.*

'Lord God, with all our hearts we beseech you: have mercy on your people; spare your people; strengthen all people in the struggle against the havoc of this pandemic. Lord our God, without you we are so weak and our courage so limited. Give us your strength; give us your love; give us wisdom and skill to continue this fight. Spare your people, O Lord we pray. Comfort those who mourn and gather into your kingdom all who have died. We make this prayer through Christ our Lord, who died and rose to life, who lives and reigns with you, for ever and ever. Amen.'

The cardinal continues after he gives this prayer: "bless each other." As a child, my mother or father used to come to my bedside each night to settle me for sleep. I was kissed goodnight and then, either my Mum or Dad would make the sign of the cross on my forehead. They gave me their blessing. This brought me such security. I remember it to this day. Then I slept in peace.

So please do not hesitate, within your household or 'bubble', to bless each other every day during this Lent. We do well to remember together our need of the good Lord. Together, and through each other, he wants to comfort and reassure us of his loving presence. If, on this day, we set aside every pretense that we can do everything of ourselves, then we create in our hearts and lives the space for God's grace and strength to find a home in us.

## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR *CONTINUED*

This is the great invitation of Ash Wednesday and of the weeks of Lent which follow. Please do take up this invitation. Open your hearts to the gift of God's presence to support, comfort and strengthen you."

This year even if there are differences, the parish is offering several different possibilities to help all have a good Lent. Please take a Lenten guide pamphlet or look online for it. Use the little book that you can pick up any day in the vestibule of the church. Come in person we hope or online for the parish retreat that will be led by Deacon Zach on Thursday's beginning, March 4th. Be challenged by the biblical study Fr. Ngema will provide on Tuesday's via Zoom (*the link can be found in the Friday Flocknote*). Lenten soup on Tuesday and virtual stations give us many things to choose from. We hope each will provide a means to help all have a good Lent!

## WEEKLY LENTEN REFLECTION



### Second Week of Lent Year B Obedience

Genesis 22:1-2, 9a, 10-13, 15-18

Psalms 116:10, 15-19

*I will walk before the Lord, in the land of the living.*

Romans 8:31b-34

Mark 9:2-10

The story of Abraham and Isaac is a precursor to the story of God the Father who says of Jesus, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." In the letter to the Romans, St Paul sums it up. "If God is for us, who can be against us? He ... did not spare his own Son ... God did not demand that extreme sacrifice from Abraham, but praised him for his obedience. God calls us into relationship. Sin is a deliberate breaking of our relationship with God.

This week I will work on discerning what God is calling me to do. I will keep my heart open to listen and then respond like Abraham, "Here I am!" I will spend time in prayer to deepen my relationship with God.



The law of fasting allows one full meal and two smaller ones.

The law of abstinence prohibits the eating of meat. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.

The obligation of abstinence begins at age 14. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

Please join us as we support our own St. Vincent de Paul Society Conference to collect items for their Easter Basket program. SVdP will distribute baskets to 100 families who are the most vulnerable and in significant need due to the pandemic.

We will be collecting items listed below after Mass on Sunday, March 7th and Sunday, March 14th. Volunteers will be stationed by the playground area with car trunks open for collection.

**Items needed:**

- 75 small-to-medium-sized empty Easter baskets
- 75 small-to-medium-sized new stuffed animals
- A variety of wrapped Easter candy for 200 children
- \$25 gift cards from Safeway for 100 families to purchase food

During this Lenten season, the Social Justice Committee also wants to highlight the increased need SVdP is facing to help many more Oakland families who are struggling to pay utilities and meet rent commitments due to loss of jobs. The CA Eviction Moratorium has been extended, but still requires eligible families pay at least 25% of their monthly rent in order to avoid eviction. This is still a hardship –consider a mother of 3 seeking assistance from SVdP who is renting a small apartment for \$1500/month. Under the moratorium law, she is required to pay \$375/month on top of utilities, groceries, car insurance, and more – without a steady income, paying even a reduced rent has been impossible, and after 5 months, she owes \$1,857 just in rent while she continues to struggle paying utilities and insurance while prioritizing food for her children. In addition, her children are doing distance learning, which has made it impossible for her to find work. This young family is just one example of unimaginable numbers of families that SVdP and other organizations help keep from being homeless.


