I continue to recommend that you check the Vatican website for insights and how the process is moving among the billion that call ourselves Catholic. One of our dear parishioners likes to point out that 'catholic' is based on the Greek that means that all are welcome (to gather around the table). I pray that this whole process is the continuation of many good things to come led by God's Spirit.

Special thanks to Keri Nims and Jenny Bruni who planned and facilitated the parish sessions. Alicia Ortegon brought the school teachers and staff together for their own session. Cathy Brady, Melody Marr and Rob Cakebread took care of many behind the scenes logistics and Lydia Deck and Sharon Chipman and others provided great insights and delivery during the process.

The comments have been recorded and a format has been given to us by the diocese. When the synthesis of all the sessions is completed it will be sent to the diocesan office. I will also make sure it is accessible to all. Finally if you still have a comment to make, there are some direct ways to send them to the Vatican. Google it or ask around for this.

We have been quiet over the covid years and now it seems we are trying to catch up for lost time. Besides the Synod gatherings, we again welcome the spiritual opportunity that a parish retreat can bring to us. We invite you to participate in the retreat that began last Wednesday by coming to the church building or via zoom. I hope you can also tune into via zoom, Fr. Ngema's scripture

study. You will not regret this time and make sure you bring your bible.

VATICAN CITY, March 6 (Reuters) - Pope Francis last Sunday rejected Russia's use of the term "special military operation" for its invasion of Ukraine, saying the country was being battered by war and urging an immediate end to the fighting.

"In Ukraine, rivers of blood and tears are flowing. This is not just a military operation but a war which sows death, destruction and misery," the pope said in his weekly address to crowds gathered in St. Peter's Square.

The comments were the strongest the pope had yet made about the violence although, as has been the case throughout the conflict, he did not condemn Russia by name.

Instead, he repeated his appeal for peace, the creation of humanitarian corridors and a return to negotiations.

"In that martyred country the need for humanitarian assistance is growing by the hour," the pope said, speaking from a window overlooking the square. "War is madness, please stop."

Please continue to join Pope Francis, myself and many parishioners in praying for an end to this unjustified war and to pray for peace and the people of the Ukraine!




