A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

It seems developments are happening very quickly as the covid-19 virus spreads in our nation and is causing many different responses. We have already sent out a 'flock note' about precautions that will happen at Mass over the weekends, but please read any updates that may be coming in the days and weeks ahead.

I want to assure you that our parish staff is regularly discussing this, and we will keep you informed as we try to make informed decisions throughout this health crises. As always, I cannot remind you enough that if you are not feeling well, in charity please take precautions that may include not coming to Mass or other services, meetings, games, activities that are on the parish schedule. For those who remember times before Vatican II, even then, the obligations of Mass were suspended when a serious situation like the spread of a virus were present.

On a very happy note, I am able to report that thanks to many of you who have personally supported *Corazon* through the years, another successful build took place last weekend with over seventy people, many of whom were from our parish. Two homes were built for two different families who have worked for and waited a long time for this day. While we are no longer able to sponsor or support this project due to insurance and safety issues that have been communicated to us by the bishop, many individuals have continued to change the lives of people by the building of a house for those most in need in a single day. Once again for the fifteenth year, all traveled, worked and returned without a single accident, injury or mishap. I firmly believe that is worth praising and that every good action or act of generosity should be praised. As the scripture says, "and seeing your good work, all will give honor and praise to God."

Back to the current health crises, we as a Church have the one thing that the doctors, politicians, organizers don't have: prayer. Here is an excellent prayer written to this situation from *America* magazine. I encourage you to pray it alone or with your family each day!

Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

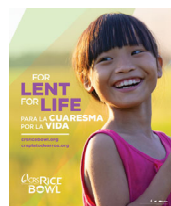
John 4:5-42

Saturday, March 28, at 3:30 pm**

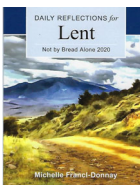
