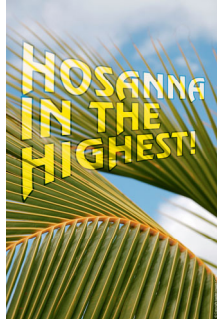

During the collection you will be invited to come forward and place your donation in a basket in front of the altar.

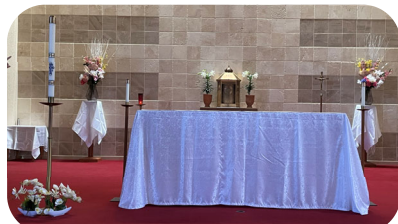

Fifth Week of Lent Year A Courage

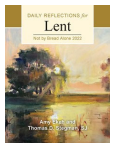
Ezekiel 37:12-14

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting allows one full meal and two smaller ones.

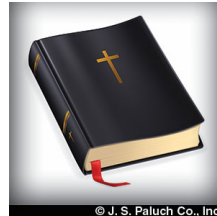
The law of abstinence prohibits the eating of meat. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.

The obligation of abstinence begins at age 14. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

There are many needy people in this part of Oakland who are on various forms of public assistance: Social Security, Unemployment, Food Stamps. Toward the end of the month, they are short on funds to buy food. The pastor at Sacred Heart asked us to deliver our food donations by the third Sunday of each month to accommodate this end-of-month situation.

Nonperishable, non-expired food donations may be left in the back of the vestibule in the basket(s) next to the "Giving Tree" at any time, up March 20.

Furniture: If you have twin bed frames, a dressing table, or a breakfast room table to donate, please contact Greg at 510-547-0911 for arrangements. There are specific needs for such furniture, primarily for senior homeless people who are moving into housing.

Bay Area Rent Relief

CA COVID-19 Rent Relief is still available. It covers 100% of rent and utilities. There is no deadline, but renters and landlords impacted by COVID-19 who need help with rent should apply immediately, before funding runs out.

Our Parish Conference of St Vincent de Paul is here to help our neighbors in need, including assisting those who qualify for California's rent relief program to apply for and receive these State funds.

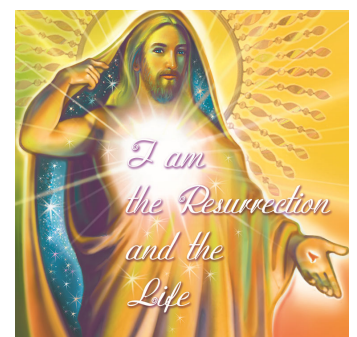
