A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Holy Week! Happy Palm Sunday!

We enter the week we call holy today with the celebration of Palm Sunday. The passion, death, and resurrection that we call the Paschal Mystery is the summit of the God who walked and walks among us. I pray that in spite of work, school and trying to restore life after too long a confinement due to the pandemic, that each of us can take extra time to pray this coming week.

I also invite you to participate in the Triduum. Come to Holy Thursday night and celebrate the Lord's example of washing his disciples' feet and instituting the Eucharist to nourish us along the way. After the Holy Thursday liturgy, stay in quiet prayer at the repository. This time reminds us of when Jesus prayed after the Passover dinner in the Garden of Gethsemane. Can you stay awake and join prayer with the Lord for a few moments?

On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross are again prayed as well as the celebration of the ancient liturgy. Join with others to hear another account of Jesus' passion. Pray with the whole Church for many peoples and needs and venerate the cross through which our sins have been forgiven. This year we are especially reminded of suffering and sin by what we see and hear about Ethiopia, Cameroon, Ukraine and other parts of our world where many unjustly die.

Holy Saturday brings the great proclamation that Jesus is Risen. As members of his Body, we hope to join all the saints and angels in this everlasting joy and transformation one day. As we witness several baptisms and renew our own Baptismal commitment, remember that we have been chosen by the Lord and called his beloved daughters and sons.

I offer an examination of conscience that may guide the end to our Lent this year. It was inspired by Pope Francis and used at many Penance Services this year. My hope is that reflection on it will help us bring a good end to Lent and make us ready for Easter!

**THE EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE IS ADAPTED FROM
REMARKS OF POPE FRANCIS.**

"Care for your spiritual life, your relationship with God."

- Am I a Christian who is not nourished by prayer and the sacraments?

- Do I study the Word of God?

"Care for your family life."

- Do I give my family time, attention, and love?

- Do I care for their daily needs?

"Heal the wounds of the heart with the oil of forgiveness."

- Have I forgiven others who have hurt me?

- Have I said "I'm sorry" to those whom I have hurt, and have I tried to make amends?

"Watch how you speak."

- Do I need to purify my everyday language from offensive words, vulgarities, and phrases used in the worldly decadence?

- Do I gossip about others or tell false truths?

"Care for your work."

- Do I work with enthusiasm and passion?

- Am I humble enough to thank the Lord for my accomplishments?

- Do I use my God-given skills and talents in the service of others?

"Avoid envy, lust, hatred, and negative feelings."

- Are my thoughts and actions destructive toward my relationships, especially with those whom I love?

- Do my thoughts destroy my inner peace?

- Do I say insulting things when it would be better to remain silent?

- Do I surround myself with angry or destructive people?

"Reach out to those who need you. this is how you will be judged."

- Do I assist the weak, the elderly, the sick?

- Do I stand up for foreigners or for those who are oppressed?

- Do I feed the hungry and shelter the homeless?

"Let go of....."

- "The bitterness that brings us to revenge"

- "The laziness that leads to existential euthanasia"

- "The finger-pointing that leads to pride"

- "The complaining that leads to despair"

April 14th

MASS OF OUR LORD'S SUPPER
7:00 PM

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT FOLLOWING THE LITURGY, ENDING AT 10:00 PM

This evening's celebration begins the Triduum. The Holy Oils that were blessed at the Diocesan Chrism Mass will be received and placed in a place of honor in the sanctuary. These are the oils that will be used throughout the year.

Jesus' command to serve others is recalled this night with the Washing of the Feet. Everyone is encouraged to participate by having their foot washed and in turn washing the foot of a fellow parishioner. Please wear shoes and socks that are easy to remove.

The liturgy does not end. We will solemnly process the Eucharist to the altar of repose where there will be adoration until 10:00 PM.

Good Friday ~ April 15th

This is the second day of the Triduum. It is a continuation of the liturgy begun the night before. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. This is not a Lenten fast, as Lent ended at dusk on Thursday, but a fast of anticipation.

1:15—3:00 PM

Liturgy of the Word ~ Veneration of the Cross
Holy Communion

At noon there will be music and reflective readings on the Stations of the Cross, followed by the Celebration of the Lord's Passion, Veneration of the Cross and distribution of Holy Communion (*Mass is not celebrated this day; the Eucharistic Bread was consecrated on Holy Thursday*).

There will be a collection for the Shrines in the Holy Land and Missionary work during the 1:15 pm service.



EASTER Vigil

APRIL 16TH ~~~ 8:00 PM

The Easter Vigil is the high point of the Easter Triduum celebrating the passion and resurrection of Jesus.

The four parts of the Easter Vigil move us through a gradual unfolding of its mystery.

THE LITURGY OF LIGHT, where the fire is blessed and we are led through the darkness by the light of the Paschal Candle.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD, where through the scripture we listen to the stories of God's interaction with the human race from creation to the resurrection.

THE LITURGY OF THE RITES OF INITIATIONS, where water is blessed, and we baptize Behzad, Jack and Cruz and receive Greg who desires to be Catholic and confirmed.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST, where we gather around our table to give thanks, and are strengthened with the spiritual food of Christ's body and blood and the newly confirmed receive the final Sacrament of Initiation, the Body and Blood of Jesus.

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting allows one full meal and two smaller ones.

The law of abstinence prohibits the eating of meat. The Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the United States.

The obligation of abstinence begins at age 14. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59.

Psalm 22: 8-9, 17-20, 23-24


My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?

Luke 22:14—23:56

In Luke we hear the familiar words of the Passion story. Isaiah, in a reading about the suffering servant, declares "The Lord is my help." Jesus says the words of the psalm of the day, "My God, my God, why have you abandoned me?" Paul tells us that Jesus was exalted by God and given the name above all other names. Can I come to praise God even in my sufferings? The first step is to trust God. Trust is a decision.

This week I will look at my life and decide where I need to trust God. I will make that decision and commitment, and make it again, and again, and again, as often and for as long as I need to for it to become a habitual way of thinking. Yes, the Lord is my help.

CA COVID-19 Rent Relief is still available. It covers 100% of rent and utilities. There is no deadline, but renters and landlords impacted by COVID-19 who need help with rent should apply immediately, before funding runs out.

Our Parish Conference of St Vincent de Paul is here to help our neighbors in need, including assisting those who qualify for California's rent relief program to apply for and receive these State funds.


