A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Easter! Christ is Risen! Alleluia!

I love tulips they are heralds of spring and the Paschal (Easter) celebration. A friend of mine once told me that tulips reminded her of chalices. The cup on old chalices and many wine glasses are tulip shaped. Remembering this got me to think about two things that I am missing again this Easter time.

The first is our annual parish Passover Seder celebration which we held the week before Holy Week. The second is our being able to receive the Blood of Christ by sharing in the communion cup.

The Gospel of Luke portrays the Last Supper as a Jewish celebration of Passover (Pesach). Passover celebrates the liberation of God's people from slavery. Four cups of wine are drunk during the Passover meal. Each cup celebrates a phrase used by God to describe the liberation of the Children of Israel: 1. "I will take you out..." 2. "I will save you..." 3. "I will redeem you..." 4. "I will take you as a nation..." Each cup is a toast to the God who leads us from harsh enslavement to the freedom of God's children. Each cup reminds us to stand with those who seek freedom. As Christians, this reminds us of what God has done for us in Jesus' passion death and resurrection.

These days are thoughts are with the Ukrainian people, the Ethiopian people, people in Cameroon and Sudan and all other places where oppression and injustice continue to dominate. It may also remind us of what enslaves us. The Covid confinement definitely has changed life for all of us over the past two years.

Wine is considered a royal drink that symbolizes the promise of freedom. It is an appropriate beverage to celebrate human liberation. At every Passover celebration there is a fifth ceremonial cup of wine that is poured. It is left untouched waiting for the prophet Elijah who will arrive one day to herald the glorious coming of the Messiah.

To the significance of Passover, Jesus will add the meaning of his own Passover from death to new life. Like Moses, Christ liberates us from all forms of enslavement, but especially to sin and the fear of death. The drinking of the cup at the celebration of the Eucharist has many layers of meaning that speak to our liberation which we proclaim and celebrate each Easter and each Sunday and every time we celebrate Mass.

In the gospels, drinking from the cup is a sign of courageous discipleship. "Can you drink the cup I will drink?" Jesus challenges. In the garden Jesus himself uses the term "cup" to refer to the ordeal he is about to face. Jesus prays to the Father: "take this cup from me, but your will be done..."

Communion from the cup implies our willingness to be a martyr (literally "witness") to sacrifice one's life like Jesus for the Kingdom. Easter proclaims our freedom from the penances of Lent and the ultimate freedom one day from death itself.

The Eucharistic Cup is also a renewal of our covenant-relationship in Christ. In the meal that Jesus asked us to celebrate, he commands us to both eat and drink. Bread, broken and shared reminds us of our unity. Blood, as the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us of, is the central sign of the New Covenant and our unity in the Lord. Our sacramental sharing in the one cup expresses this.

Paul writes as we share in his death through baptism, so one day we will share eternal resurrected life with all the saints and angels for eternity!

I have been asked by parishioners when will we return to sharing the cup and holding a seder meal again. I said we will have to get through all this Covid stuff first. In the meantime, we must forego the common cup but not forget its significance. We are called to transform the world with Christ's love.

Now we are called to pray for and help as we can our sisters and brothers in the Ukraine and all other places of oppression. It is a sacrifice we make out of love as we await the day when we can share the "cup of eternal redemption" again.

Christ is risen! Blessings to you and yours in this Holy Season! Like Christmas, we do not celebrate Easter on one day alone. It is so amazing and wonderful what God has done for us because God loves us that we celebrate for several weeks.

Thanks to all of you who join us this weekend! Your presence enriches each of us! Thank you for your continuing support. May the Easter season bring joy and hope to you and your families! May it bring peace to a war-torn world still waiting for the fullness of redemption!





EASTER VIGIL
 APRIL 16TH ~~~ 8:00 PM

The Easter Vigil is the high point of the Easter Triduum celebrating the passion and resurrection of Jesus.

The four parts of the Easter Vigil move us through a gradual unfolding of its mystery.

THE LITURGY OF LIGHT, where the fire is blessed and we are led through the darkness by the light of the Paschal Candle.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD, where through the scripture we listen to the stories of God's interaction with the human race from creation to the resurrection.

THE LITURGY OF THE RITES OF INITIATIONS, where water is blessed, and we baptize Behzad, Jack and Cruz and receive Greg who desires to be Catholic and confirmed.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST, where we gather around our table to give thanks, and are strengthened with the spiritual food of Christ's body and blood and the newly confirmed receive the final Sacrament of Initiation, the Body and Blood of Jesus.
