A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

This weekend we welcome our bishop, Michael Barber, S.J. who will celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for seventeen young women and men in our parish. They are prepared even though most of their preparation took place during the pandemic time of confinement and other restrictions. A sign that we are on the right track to getting some things back to normal is that the bishop will celebrate the Confirmation Mass inside the church building. Last year with our Vicar General, Confirmation was celebrated outside on the playground.

Congratulations to our Confirmandi. We pray the Holy Spirit will guide the rest of your lives and we look forward to walking along your side in the parish as we navigate the way to our God in our daily lives. We welcome you to the ministries that you will hopefully soon become involved in at the parish. Thanks also to our bishop. He celebrates Confirmation in about half of the diocesan parishes each year and we are grateful for his presence with us this year.

May is traditionally the month of First Communions (May 22 this year), Confirmations and a time to focus on the Blessed Virgin Mary. As we have just celebrated a national recognition of Mothers, we honor Holy Mary as a mother of us all. By her yes to the angel, she brought the source of life into our world. By our baptism we become part of the Body of Christ and thus by extension are daughters and sons of Holy Mary.

The Blessed Mother shows us the way of saying yes to God's will in our daily lives and she becomes the prime example of what it means to be a disciple of Christ.

We are all familiar with Mary's humble beginnings, her deep faith, grace, and docile nature, and her nurturing presence during the life of our Lord, Jesus. But what are we to learn from our Spiritual mother?

In his apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium* (The Joy of the Gospel), Pope Francis called Mary, the mother of evangelization.

"With the Holy Spirit, Mary is always present in the midst of the people," he wrote. "She joined the disciples in praying for the coming of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:14) and thus made possible the missionary outburst which took place at Pentecost. She is the mother of the Church which evangelizes, and without her, we could never understand the spirit of the new evangelization."

"As a true mother, she walks at our side, she shares our struggles and she constantly surrounds us with God's love," Pope Francis also wrote.



When it comes to discipleship, the Blessed Mother is the example Catholics are called to follow.

One author commenting on Pope Francis' exhortation wrote, "Marian devotions, the rosary, the different canticles, give us a sense of the surrendering to God in our lives, having that relationship with God which builds up who we are in relationship with Christ."

"Even the titles the Church gives her – Mother of God, Mother of the Church, Queen of Heaven, Intercessor on our behalf—shows how she leads us to her son, Jesus Christ."

Bruce Croteau, in writing about Holy Mary for the Diocese of Orlando, said we also see the human side of Mary in Scripture, especially in the Gospel of Luke 2:41-52, when the boy Jesus got lost at the Temple.

"After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him, "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety" (Luke 2:46,48).

"We see a little bit of frustration on Mary's part as a mother," Croteau said. "That helps us to understand that Mary, too, had the same pressures upon her that modern day mothers have with regards to their children."

Croteau also noted that Mary was contemplative, pondered things in her heart. Still, she did not question. She said God's will be done.

"When you think about her steadfast witness, that is one of the first prerequisites of evangelization," Croteau said. "She was solid in her faith and knew God would do what God had said. She was a trusting servant."

"Scriptures have taught us a lot about Mary and her relationship with Christ, being the mother of Christ, being a disciple, a true follower," We are all called to follow her path."

Meal prep in SVdP's kitchen and dining room involves helping to prep, cook and serve take-away lunches. Shifts are Tuesdays - Saturdays 8:30 am - 12:30 pm.

Volunteers in SVdP's Women and Children's Center provide assistance for laundry, showers, hygiene products and children's clothes and diapers. Shifts are Tuesdays - Saturdays 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm - 3:30 pm.

SVdP's Community Center offers volunteers an opportunity to assist checking in their guests and providing help in the clothing closet, along with mail distribution and referrals to other agencies. Shifts are Tuesdays - Saturdays 9:00 am - 12:00 pm and 1:00pm - 3:30 pm.

The Community Center provides for those struggling with homelessness, addiction, joblessness and mental health challenges with free meals, showers, clean clothing and a place to rest and learn about available resources for their specific needs. A gated and secure parking lot is available for volunteers' cars.




THE BREAKING OF BREAD

Our Easter season is close to ending when we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord. The Bible contains three accounts of the Ascension of Jesus—the Gospels of Mark and Luke and the Acts of the Apostles (Acts). Today we hear the story in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles and in Mark's Gospel. We also find one at the end of the Gospel of Luke (24:50–53). Luke wrote both a Gospel and Acts.

Luke begins his Acts by addressing it to Theophilus. Theophilus is a Greek name that means "friend of God" or "loved by God." You are a friend of God and God loves you. The stories in the book of Acts were meant for you to hear, too.

Later in the book of Acts Luke describes what the community of those who follow Jesus looked like. They listened to and followed the teaching of the apostles. They shared what they had and helped people in need. They gathered together for "the breaking of bread" and prayer, what we now call the Mass. These are actions that followers of Jesus continue to do today.

In the scroll, write a letter to Luke telling him how you are still practicing the actions he encouraged in the early Christians. Remember to be faithful to "the breaking of bread," that is, going to Mass, and to praying every day.
