

## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Congratulations to our school administration and faculty for getting to the end of another Covid challenged year and for receiving the highest accreditation for an elementary school from the WCEA (Western Catholic Education Association).

What is WCEA/WASC (Western Association of Schools and Colleges) Accreditation? Accreditation is a process of ongoing school improvement. Its ultimate goal is to work toward the highest student achievement, and to always be on the road to improvement. The Catholic version of WASC is guided by the diocesan school's mission statement and in support of the parish. A part of the accreditation process that is not found in the secular process asks about the 'Catholicity' of the school.

We should all be proud of the school that has educated parish children and non-parish children since 1958. I encourage every parishioner to tell others about our fine school and if they have children who might enroll here, let them know how they can contact the parish or school office for more information.

All our hearts were broken last week when we heard about another school massacre. Senseless and horrible is an understatement. As I said last week in my homily, I am not against people owning guns. Members of my family are hunters and have hunting rifles, but I do question why anyone who would need to own a war weapon that mutilates what it hits and would not be used for hunting but only as a weapon of war.

We pray again for the victims of these assaults, but can we do more? Restrictions do not deny one's rights but seek to govern them for the common good (as our driving license restrictions or ability to purchase alcohol at a certain age). Any killing with these assault war weapons is not an exercise of a constitutional right or an action that serves the common good. But this is being abused and we can fix it! Other countries like New Zealand most recently have confronted this issue with success.

As a priest of forty years, some of the most difficult times I have had to preach has been when a child dies. I have presided over funerals for children who died of heart disease, car accidents, and other maladies, but I

cannot imagine having to preach at one of the nineteen upcoming funerals for the children of Uvalde. No parent should ever have to bury their child! We believe in the Resurrection, but it is unfair to the children who are being killed and the families and friends who remain behind. Forever their lives will be broken because of this unnecessary loss.



So, I ask all if you to think if there are ways our parish can be more active in guaranteeing the safety of every child and fellow citizen in the United States from these assaults, please let us know. I intend to contact U.S. Senators in my own name, but maybe a whole community would be more effective in creating better change. Am I mixing politics with religion? Yes, but when several parents this past week told me they were fearful when they dropped their children off for school or a sport's game and asked why God would allow this, I must speak.

Since I've mentioned politics, several of you also spoke to me about another political situation in our own Bay Area. My response is best said succinctly by quoting another archbishop whom I believe reflects the teaching of Pope Francis and many in the Church.

*A message to the faithful of the archdiocese (of Dubuque) from Archbishop Michael Jackels*

### ***Repair scandal through the healing of the Eucharist***

*Pity the grocery shoppers in Buffalo, the school kids in Texas, their grieving families, and everyone now more afraid than ever of doing those simple, everyday things.*

*You've got to wonder about reasons for refusing reasonable limits on gun ownership, which are inspired by the common good and offering protection from harm.*

*We readily identify things like abortion and capital punishment as life issues, which Catholic teaching identifies as absolutely wrong under any circumstance.*

## A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR CONTINUED

*But protecting the earth, our common home, or making food, water, shelter, education and health care accessible, or defense against gun violence... these are life issues too.*

*Some people want to repair the scandal of pro-choice Catholic politicians by refusing them the Eucharist. But that's a misguided response for at least two reasons:*

*As Jesus said, it's the sick people who need a doctor, not the healthy, and he gave us the Eucharist as a healing remedy; don't deny the people who need the medicine.*

*Also, to be consistent, to repair the scandal of Catholics being indifferent or opposed to all those other life issues, they would have to be denied Holy Communion as well.*

*Better, I think, to put the Eucharist in the hands of such Catholics in hopes that one day soon they would put their hands to work on behalf of life, in defense of all life.*

Jesus gives us the Eucharist because we are all sinners in need of his presence to guide us on a path of repentance, to unite us, help us build God's Kingdom and lead us one day to heaven. My prayer is we will always see the Eucharist in the above terms.
