A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

We congratulate the eighth grade of St. Theresa school who graduated during the past week. They join classes since 1958 who call the beginning roots of their education, St. Theresa School. This year a fine group of twenty-five graduate and they are scattering to various Catholic high schools as well as some fine other schools such as De La Salle, St. Mary's, O'Dowd, and Oakland Tech to name a few.

On behalf of the parish, we send them forth knowing that even after a very strange year of online learning and other challenges they will excel in their future studies. St. Theresa School boasts of an almost 100% of students who will go and succeed in college. May God bless these graduates and help them to follow their heart's desires as they continue the journey of learning.

If you have come on the parish site, you may have noticed a smaller tribute to Judy Koneffklatt on the fence leading to the school. It is extremely hard to believe that a year has passed since her sudden and very untimely passing. Judy's family has expressed on several occasions their appreciation for all the prayers, ongoing outreach and support given to them during this year. Last week, we celebrated a memorial Mass for Judy geared to our school children but for all of us to again remember her and pray for her peace for her family. As Catholics, that is what we do, and I am incredibly grateful to be in the midst of a parish community that demonstrates this so well. May Judy rest in peace, but also intercede for us as we continue the journey.

I fully expected Judy to be at my side when repair work began on the Event Center after the lawsuit the diocese brought against the contractors was settled. Judy was here when it was built and could identify areas that need repair beyond what the experts analyzed. I am not allowed by the agreement now signed by the diocese to give every detail, but I do want all to know that work to repair some of the defects will begin hopefully right after school finishes the academic year on June 10. Judy and I were clear that the best time for construction and repairs was during school breaks. The main coordinating contractor is Oliver and Company, and they understand the logic of this request. The work that the diocese is now approving will take approximately four months so when school starts on August 23, it will be

continuing. The representatives from Oliver are very aware of this and will work with the parish and school to interrupt as little as possible our ongoing life on site.

Therefore, expect to see equipment, trenches, and other signs of construction as the work begins. Ultimately, the parish and school will finally have a center that is safe, mold free, water-proofed, and open for all the activities that take place there during any given year. As new details emerge, I will keep you posted.



We join Fr. Tegha and his whole family in Cameroon mourning his mom and his aunt. Prayer does work at these times, and I know we are all doing extra prayer for the eternal rest of these women and for consolation of our faith for Fr. Tegha and his family. Fr. Tegha mentioned when he briefly visited to celebrate Fr. Ngema's graduation that he hoped to return and spend some time here after a summer course at Notre Dame. I hope he does and when he is here will try to hold a special Mass for the strengthening of his family during this challenging time of great sorrow. A few have already asked if they could make financial donations for his family. I do not have details if this is appropriate at this writing but will keep you posted as needs are clarified and how we can help is clearer.

As I mentioned at Sunday Mass, when my brother, Bill was killed by a drunk driver in 2000, I had the challenge of being the priest for my family. I distinctly remember the funeral Mass when I was both the consoler and a mourner. I prayed for the right words that would help my mom and all Bill's family and friends who were in shock at his passing. I felt an amazing peace like no other when I began the funeral Mass. Later, I learned that 350 people got up early and celebrated a Mass at 6am for me and my family. (6am California time because the funeral was at 9am New York time.) It showed me again that prayer works and can make a difference.

May we pray for all who grieve for veterans, or those recently massacred in San Jose and Miami. May we all trust that our prayer for each other in good times and in bad makes a difference!

SERVICE OPPORTUNITY!

The SJC joins with St. Vincent de Paul’s longstanding service project and UCSF Benioff Children’s Hospital project launched last Fall to collect new backpacks and school supplies for Oakland children in need. SVdP will be collecting supplies for 200 children to be distributed at their *Back to School for Your Kids* program scheduled early August. The Primary Care Clinic of Children’s Hospital will be collecting school supplies for their large population of children seen throughout the year who live in neighborhoods impacted by poverty, gun violence, substandard housing, and other conditions that affect their health and well-being.

 **ST. VINCENT DE PAUL**

The eviction moratoriums in response to the COVID-19 pandemic are generally set to expire at the end of June, at which time St Vincent de Paul expects an increase in requests for help as neighbors whose income sources declined as a result of the economic fallout.

Still reeling from the murder of her son two years ago, Tina is slowly getting her life together. She was a vibrant member of her community before, participating in the urban VISTA program as well as campaigns to improve the lives of prisoners. Then came her son’s death and she was left her without the energy for day to day tasks. Tina admits that she saw the EBMUD bill on her coffee table, ‘But I couldn’t bring myself to open it.’ (NOTE: She has filled out an application for the CAP program so this won’t happen again.)

Even with diabetes and a bad back Tina still cares for her severely autistic grandson every day after school until his mother gets home. She is grateful that St. Vincent de Paul can help her get through this rough time so she can get back to her life.

Please help us continue to help our neighbors in need, like Tina, and consider donating to our parish SVdP Conference through the Flocknote link.

This year our Conference is collaborating with our parish’s new Social Justice Committee to collect supplies for St. Vincent de Paul’s annual backpack/school supplies drive, as well as for other children in need. Please stay tuned for details shared on the Social Justice Committee corner.



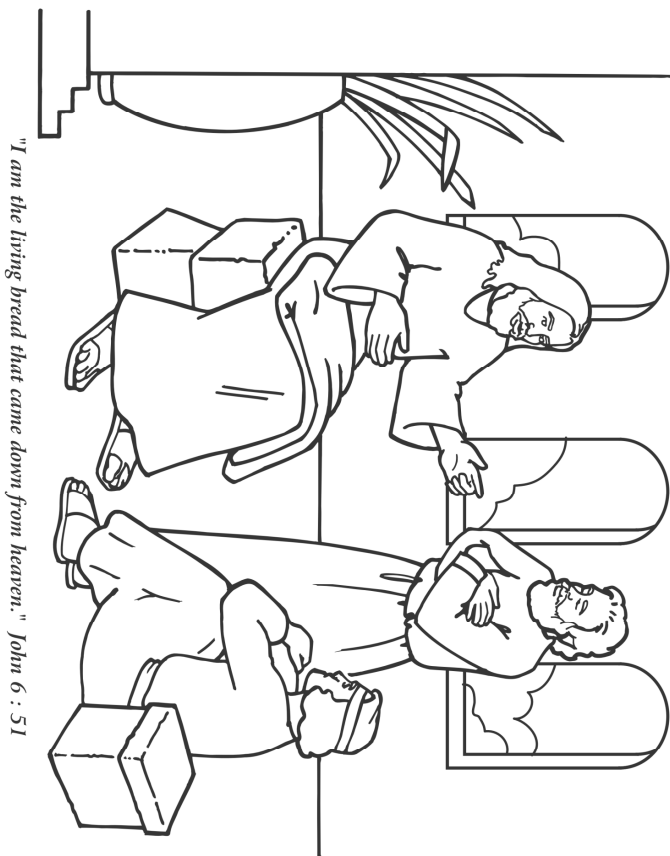

PRAYERS, WORKS, JOYS, AND SUFFERINGS

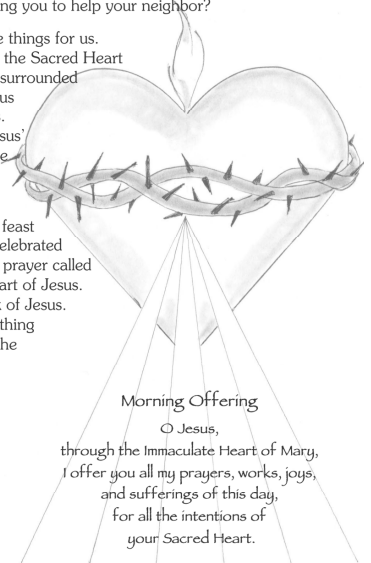
What do you think of when you see a picture of a heart? Love? The importance of your heart for your health and life? Your heart encouraging you to help your neighbor?

The heart of Jesus is a model of all these things for us. You can search for a picture of an image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on line. The heart in the picture is surrounded by a crown of thorns. It reminds us that Jesus loved us so much that he gave his life for us. The flame above the heart reminds us of Jesus' burning love for all people. The rays that shine from the heart remind us of the many ways Jesus' love brings light and life to others.

On Friday, June 8, we will celebrate the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This feast is celebrated nineteen days after Pentecost every year. A prayer called the Morning Offering is dedicated to the heart of Jesus. It unites us each day with the love and work of Jesus. The words express our desire to offer everything we do and say to Jesus so that his work in the world can continue.

Part of the prayer is printed here. Cut it out and place it on a mirror you look into every day. Try to learn it and pray it every morning as you begin your day.
