

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Happy Father's Day to all the dads, grandfathers, godfathers, soon to be fathers, a person who was like a father to someone! The parish blesses you and prays that you are and continue to be the best of fathers in your example and actions to your children and all the parish echoing the blessing prayer for fathers at the conclusion of the Baptism ceremony.

Jesus uses the image of a father when the disciples ask him to teach them to pray. Dr. Marcellino D'Ambriosio has a wonderful description of what this image is about:

"To call God "Father" does not mean to say, of course, that he is an old man with a white beard. Only the second person of the Blessed Trinity wedded himself to a male human nature in the womb of Mary. The Father and the Holy Spirit are pure Spirit and transcend male and female, masculine and feminine (CCC 239).

This is no new insight brought to Christianity by the feminist movement. It has always been taught that the word "Father" applied to God, is used by way of analogy. Analogies tell us something very true despite being imperfect. Until recently, the father was recognized by Western society as origin, head, and provider of the family. To call the first person of the Trinity "Father" means that he is the origin and transcendent authority of all and cares for the needs of all.

But we all instinctively know that a father who just pays the bills and barks orders is not enough. We expect a dad to have an intimate, affectionate relationship with his children, to spend "quality time" with them. To call God "Father" means, then, that he is near to us, intimately concerned with us, fond of us, even crazy about us. He is not the distant, clockmaker God of Thomas Jefferson and the Deists. This aloof God of the philosophers created the world to run by virtue of its own natural laws so that he could withdraw and occupy himself with more interesting pursuits.

No, the God whom Jesus calls Father cares about us and knows us intimately. "Every hair on your head is numbered (Matthew 10:30)." He loves us more than we love ourselves and knows us better than we know ourselves.

Now, this does not mean that He makes all things go smoothly for us. He loves us so much that He made us in His image and likeness, which means He made us free. And through the free choice of the first man and woman, evil and death were invited into our world.

God does not shield us from all the troublesome consequences of this "original sin" which each of us, sadly, has ratified with our own personal sin. But He sent us prophets, like Jeremiah, to wake us up and warn us of the horrible consequences of disobedience. And finally, He sent his firstborn Son to be a new Adam, to pay the price of that disobedience and give the human race an undeserved new start.



The most horrible consequence of sin, eternal death (Gehenna), has been graciously removed for all who accept the free gift of salvation that comes by way of the cross of Christ. But evil is still at large in the world, and evil brings trials and tribulations.

Our Father will not shelter us from these any more than He sheltered Jeremiah (Jer. 20:10-13) or Jesus. A good father doesn't protect his children forever from the harsh realities of life but helps them as they progress through various stages of development to face the challenges and grow through the difficulties. Scripture says that even Jesus learned obedience through what he suffered (Heb. 5:8-9). How much more do we need to learn and mature, and some learning can only take place through suffering.

So as a true Father, he loves us too much to take us out of the fray. But there's one thing we can be sure of—He'll never leave us to fight our battles alone."

I did not write this much about mothers on Mother's Day, but I think with the first clarification above from Dr. D'Ambriosio that God is neither masculine nor feminine, we could apply his whole article to honor every mother. Pope Francis has made the fourth Sunday of July (close to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne) World Grandparent's Day. More to follow on this new remembrance.

This week when you arrive you will notice some construction equipment on the parish site property. Some repairs will finally commence on the Event Center, meeting rooms, computer lab and parish office/school library, T-K classroom. I have asked for a fuller description from the diocese as they are in charge of this process. As I get information, I will keep you informed.

WORSHIP UPDATE GUIDELINES FROM THE DIOCESE OF OAKLAND

There is no-longer a restriction on capacity for indoor services, provided there is adequate ventilation. The doors and windows will remain open in the church.

If you have been vaccinated you do not need to wear a mask indoors. However, non-vaccinated persons, including minors, must wear masks indoors.

Taking people's temperature is not required.

Missalettes are again available. Place them on the table at the exit door when leaving church, do not leave in pew.

The singing of hymns and acclamations may resume.

The Sign of Peace should still be exchanged without physical contact, except for family members.

It is strongly encouraged that the faithful receive Communion in the hand.

The diocese is not authorizing the distribution of the Precious Blood for the time being.

Ministers of communion should remain masked for the foreseeable future. It is recommended but not required, that they be vaccinated.

The faithful are encouraged to return to participating in the Sunday Mass if their health permits. The lifting of the dispensation from Sunday Mass Obligation will come into force on Sunday, August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITY!

The SJC joins with St. Vincent de Paul's longstanding service project and UCSF Benioff Children's Hospital project launched last Fall to collect new backpacks and school supplies for Oakland children in need. SVdP will be collecting supplies for 200 children to be distributed at their *Back to School for Your Kids* program scheduled early August. The Primary Care Clinic of Children's Hospital will be collecting school supplies for their large population of children seen throughout the year who live in neighborhoods impacted by poverty, gun violence, substandard housing, and other conditions that affect their health and well-being.

**ST. VINCENT DE PAUL**

Anticipating requests for financial help as the COVID-19 eviction moratoriums expire, we are re-sharing pre-pandemic stories of neighbors in need helped by our parish SVdP Conference:

"We found our neighbor in need Keisha smiling and cheerful despite her PG&E having been shut off for several days. She inherited a 100-year-old house from her mother three years ago but unfortunately it came with a reverse mortgage. Probate is just finishing and soon she will have a mortgage payment. Keisha works with a temp agency now but recently got 90% on a test for a better job so things are looking up. Meanwhile Keisha took in some tenants who ended up leaving her with huge utility bills including one for \$1,284 to PG&E. She had already put together \$450 but PG&E required \$300 more to turn on the lights."

Your generosity to our Parish conference made it possible for us to pay this amount for her."

Your generosity over the years has helped neighbors like Keisha get back on their feet.







Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time


NATIVITY OF JOHN THE BAPTIST

The Nativity of John the Baptist is a feast with a significant title. It is not the birthday of John the Baptist. Birthdays celebrate the anniversary of the day on which we were born, but we don't know the day on which John was born. Instead we celebrate his "nativity," which means that we celebrate his birth itself. In some ways, John is born anew today as we remember how he continues to be an important part of our Christian family: he is the one who points the way to Jesus.

The Church celebrates only two other nativities during the liturgical year, the birth of Jesus and the birth of Mary. This puts John in very important company. It also puts us in special company, too. Jesus said about John and about us, "Among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he" (Matthew 11:11). Jesus reminds us that John is the one who points the way. We are the ones who must continue John's work by pointing others toward Jesus and being as great as Jesus calls us to be.

June 24 is also called Midsummer Day, halfway between the first day of spring and the first day of autumn. It is often celebrated with bonfires to remind us of the light that John pointed us toward—the Light of the world, Jesus.

You might have a fire pit to gather around on John's feast day. But even if you can't light a fire you could gather around the barbecue for dinner. Put away all phones and computers and enjoy being outdoors. Enjoy foods cooked on the grill. Enjoy talking with your family. Use your voices as John used his to bring good news and joy to everyone. Use some honey—a food that John himself ate in the desert—to create a delicious dessert. This is one of the longest days of summer, made for us to enjoy!
