A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Last week we happily were told if we were vaccinated, we didn't have to wear a mask and could sit closer to one another at Mass. I thank all who pulled the red tape from every other pew to open things up, it was great not needing a crew to do that. We received some guidelines from the bishop and unlike all the dioceses around us, the dispensation from the obligation for Sunday Mass remains in effect until August 15. Around us, (SF, Santa Rosa, Sacramento, Stockton dioceses) the obligation has been re-instated for all by the end of June.

Last week with our reinstated freedoms, I ventured out and found not everyone is so free. I went to COSTCO without a mask and quickly noticed that everyone in the store had a mask on. I put one on by the time I got the third aisle. I went to Rockridge AAA, and the door was locked, and they would not let me in until I put on a mask. Everyone seemed masked in Safeway and Grocery Outlet.

We have put everyone on the honor system. If you have not been vaccinated, we ask that you wear a mask inside the church and any of the parish buildings. BUT I want to make clear that wearing a mask does not mean someone is not vaccinated I know that was not the case in the stores I mention above. People have various reasons for continuing to wear a mask and **no one** should make a judgement about anyone or **even ask someone** why they are continuing to wear a mask. A friend of mine has received both doses of the vaccine. When tested for antigens two weeks after the second dose, it showed no sign of antigens. He is immune compromised because of chemotherapy. He is very private and does not want the world to know about his illness. He would not come to church if he got hit with many questions about why he continues to wear a mask.

Let us keep up the good practices that have gotten us this far and let us respect one another and fully beat this virus together.

The pandemic challenged us, and many other issues and situations will challenge us as a Church. I encourage all to support again the school supply drive again begun by our social justice committee. If you come on the parish site, you will notice the construction that has begun to repair the event center. We could spend a lot of time wondering and asking

how this happened in the first place but let us rejoice that it will soon be better and safer for all. I promise a fuller report and description at the end of the summer that we are just beginning. And I have asked and been promised that diocesan officials will come to shed light on the defects found and explain how they are now fixing them.



The readings last week were very timely. As I said Jesus is with us even when storms hit. The following words from a contemporary Irish homily may shed more light and I again promise that after vacation I will do my best to answer questions you may have about many storms that surround us.

The disciples (like most of us) had been with Jesus for some time and had witnessed God powerfully at work in and through him. That experience should have been enough to reassure them that, despite the raging storm, all would be well, because Jesus was with them. He had said to them at the beginning of their journey, 'let us cross over to the other side.' They should have trusted that, with Jesus with them, they would make it to the other side, despite the storm they were encountering.

The church's reputation has gone through stormy waters in recent times. Unlike the storm on the lake, the storms the church has been battling are, to a large extent, of our leaders' own making, by covering up cases of abuse in order to safeguard reputation. Perhaps, in the midst of these storms some of us may have been tempted to cry out with the disciples in the boat, 'we are going down.' We may be asking, like those disciples, where is the Lord in all of this? Like them, we may find ourselves fearful and losing faith as the church lurches from side to side in the stormy waters.

One of the messages of the storm story is that the Lord remains with the church in the storm. The Lord is present to his fearful and faithless disciples. He may rebuke us as he rebuked those disciples in the boat. However, his presence to us in the storm is not just a rebuking presence. It is ultimately a creative and life-

giving presence. Jesus brought calm out of the chaos; he tamed the storm and saw to it that the boat reached the other side. The Lord remains stronger than the storms that threaten the church, whether those storms are self-inflicted or brought on by others or a combination of both.

Like the apostles, we need to trust that Our Lord works to bring his church through the storm to a new place where, as in their case, fear gives way to awe and their rebuking question, 'Master, do you not care?' gives way to amazement, 'Who can this be? Even the winds and sea obey him.' This conviction (that the Lord of the church is stronger than the storm) should not make us complacent. Yet, it keeps us hopeful and faithful, even when so much seems under threat. Today's responsorial psalm assures us that if we cry to the Lord in our need, he will rescue us from our distress. Our need and distress can open us up more fully to the Lord's life-giving presence among us.

Saint Paul makes a wonderful statement at the beginning of that second reading, 'the love of Christ overwhelms us.' Another translation would be 'the love of Christ urges us on.' The love of Christ for us was revealed above all in his death on the cross. As Paul says in his letter to the Romans, 'God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us.' It is that remarkable love of God in Christ for us that urges us on, even when we are battling against a headwind. It urges us on until we reach what the gospel calls 'the other side', the place towards which the Lord is guiding the church — the place where he wants us all to be.

Stay safe. I hope many can go on vacation and be reunited with loved one they have not seen all through the pandemic. As you are reading this, I should be travelling first to Miami and then on for two weeks on Bonaire. I promise to think and pray for you every day. You are the Church and with Jesus we will weather any storm.

WORSHIP UPDATE GUIDELINES FROM THE DIOCESE OF OAKLAND

There is no-longer a restriction on capacity for indoor services, provided there is adequate ventilation. The doors and windows will remain open in the church.

If you have been vaccinated you do not need to wear a mask indoors. However, non-vaccinated persons, including minors, must wear masks indoors.

Taking people's temperature is not required.

Missalettes are again available. Place them on the table at the exit door when leaving church, do not leave in pew.

The singing of hymns and acclamations may resume.

The Sign of Peace should still be exchanged without physical contact, except for family members.

It is strongly encouraged that the faithful receive Communion in the hand.

The diocese is not authorizing the distribution of the Precious Blood for the time being.

Ministers of communion should remain masked for the foreseeable future. It is recommended but not required, that they be vaccinated.

The faithful are encouraged to return to participating in the Sunday Mass if their health permits. The lifting of the dispensation from Sunday Mass Obligation will come into force on Sunday, August 15th, the Solemnity of the Assumption.

SERVICE OPPORTUNITY!

**ST. VINCENT DE PAUL**

Anticipating requests for financial help as the COVID-19 eviction moratoriums expire, we are re-sharing pre-pandemic stories of neighbors in need helped by our parish SVdP Conference:

Lakisha had a rough year. She was doing well at the security firm where she worked and had just been certified to use a weapon—when she found out she was expecting a baby. It was against company rules for her to work while pregnant and she was going to apply for disability when the apartment where she lived with her mother, sister and nieces caught fire and burned. They lost everything and spent months moving from one motel to another. A place was finally found for them but move in day kept being delayed. Lakisha then went into premature labor and was hospitalized. Her son Earl was born at 25 weeks weighing three pounds at birth. Three months after signing the lease the family finally moved into their new apartment.

Despite all these troubles the family is very happy. They delight in the baby who at five months is chubby and alert. Lakisha's mom, Ericka, is a CNA and hopes to get back to it when her blood pressure stabilizes. While we were there her sister Shirley helped feed and dress the baby who is obviously the apple of their eyes.

Your generosity to our Parish conference made it possible for us to pay their PG&E bill and helping this family get back on its feet."
