

A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

I am happy to be back from a nice vacation. Florida and Bonaire were busy with many tourists and hopefully their economies are bouncing back safely. I was very startled to go into a grocery store in southern Florida and find that almost every customer was wearing a mask. It appeared on most of my indoor visits to places, ordinary people are taking these small basic precautions to insure their own good health and the good health of others in spite of the politics that rage in that state.

As we hear more and more bad news about the 'Delta variant' of the covid virus, I was happy to see this past Sunday that only twelve people were not wearing masks during Mass. As of August 3rd all (adults and minors) are again required to wear a mask indoors whether vaccinated or unvaccinated. Since children are not yet able to receive a vaccination, all children are asked to wear a mask. This will be the same rule when school starts in a short time. We do this because we care for one another and strongly want the pandemic to end, and the virus not have a chance to mutate into a worse variant that may be immune to our current vaccinations. Thank you for your kind consideration and action on behalf of all!

As you may have heard the bishop is reinstating the weekend Mass obligation for us on August 15. This is later than all the other dioceses around us. We have been dispensed from the Sunday Mass obligation since March of 2020. Most of you came back as soon as we were open to people again as guided by state and county regulations. Some of you are still not ready to come back for very good reasons. I want to assure you that if you have a good reason such as health or immune issues, are not feeling well on a particular Sunday or another reason, please stay home. The live stream will continue until further notice. Since walk up Communion has had almost no one over the past few weeks, that will be discontinued, but please contact the office to arrange reception privately if you desire this.

As pastor, I have the authority by canon law to dispense this obligation to individuals. If you are

not sure you have a good reason like what was mentioned above, please contact me so I can help you figure it out. We all want to be together again as we were before March 2020, but it will take time for it to fully be normal with or without a dispensation from the bishop.



As you have seen from pictures on the cover of the weekly bulletin, major work is finally happening around and inside the event center, meeting rooms, computer room, parish offices and school library and T-K room. Oliver and Co. are very aware of school coming back in a few weeks and are trying their best to do what they can to not impinge on normal fall activities. It appears work inside the gym/event center will go on through November.

I am very happy that Bill Utic (retired PG&E executive) has been overseeing the work on behalf of the diocese. He has been quick to get the OK needed when work that was not part of the plan was discovered to be needed. We have also had a couple of contractor school parents visiting and checking on things on our behalf. All are confident that the right drains are going in, waterproofing of the building is accurately being applied and air vents are no longer blocked by concrete.

When school returns, I intend to hold an open meeting with diocesan officials present who can better describe the work that was needed and is now being completed. They will also help us understand what the settlement the diocese made will cover and how we might pay for the rest needed to get a safe and protected building that our children and all of us will be able to use for many years to come.

As I said at the beginning, I am glad to be back, but also grateful for some time away from many issues that are just part of the joy of pastoring. I look forward to greeting each of you personally and have a few stories and pictures to show from my adventure away from the parish.





Many sons and daughters often grow up to be just like their mothers and fathers. Some may become teachers or bakers or artists like their parents. Augustine grew up to be just like his mother, Monica. Monica became a saint and so did Augustine. We remember St. Monica on August 27 and St. Augustine on August 28.

Augustine did not start out acting like a saint. He made many bad choices in his life. His biography gives examples of times when he lied, when he cheated and stole things. He did not treat people with respect and kindness. Throughout all those years Monica never stopped praying for her son. She prayed that God would help Augustine change his life. Then one day, with the help of another saint, Ambrose, Augustine did decide to change. He was baptized and began to travel with his mother, spreading God's word wherever they went. He shared with others what he had learned from his mother. Augustine became one of the most important and famous saints of the Church. His mother's prayers were answered. Because she never stopped praying for and loving her son, we honor Monica as the patron saint of mothers.
