A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

Every year on the First Sunday of Advent, I have greeted you in this weekly column with greetings for a 'happy new year'. Advent begins the new liturgical year and I encourage all to look at it as a time of hope and a time for new beginnings. This year like most of last year is so vastly different.

I hope all had some kind of pleasant Thanksgiving. As my custom, I helped cook a dinner, but had a much smaller number at the table following the guidance we have been given and respecting others who might have attended the understanding when they said they just want to stay home this year. We all hope we will not get exposed or come down with COVID, but as numbers seem to be rising with great speed, I congratulate all who are doing their best (wear a mask, wash your hands often, avoid unnecessary contacts and gatherings...etc.).

Following the inspiration of a commercial that says to keep a chart of all the hugs you have missed, all the embraces you would have given, all the interaction with family and friends you would have done over these past many months, I feel the same about our Church year. We began to have to stay away during Lent, could not come together for the great Easter season, missed being with our young girls and boys for First Communion and our young men and women who celebrated Confirmation. We have missed a few baptisms at Sunday Mass and have not been able to come together for funerals especially of our beloved principal, Judy KoneffKlatt and other dear friends and fellow parishioners who have passed.

Advent is set up to be a penitential season (purple vestments signify this), but also a short liturgical season of hope. Just like Holy Mary, we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our God and savior. We say every time after we pray the Our Father at Mass, "we wait in joyful hope for the coming..." My prayer each day is for all of you to trust in our loving God who walks with us through this time. My prayer is that continuing the good practices we have been asked to do with great sacrifice at times, we will soon be together and can share stories of this most unique time in our lives. Here is a prayer that I hope will offer some helpful things to comfort us:

THE OTHER SIDE OF THE VIRUS, AN OPPORTUNITY TO AWAKEN...

They say that in Wuhan after so many years of noise, you can hear the birds again. They say that after just a few weeks of quiet, the sky is no longer thick with fumes but blue and grey and clear.

They say that in the streets of Assisi people are singing to each other across the empty squares, keeping their windows open so that those who are alone may hear the sounds of family around them.

They say that a hotel in the West of Ireland is offering free meals and delivery to the housebound.

Today a young woman is busy spreading fliers with her number through the neighborhood so that the elders may have someone to call on.

Today Churches, Synagogues, Mosques and Temples are preparing to welcome and shelter the homeless, the sick, the weary.

All over the world people are slowing down and reflecting. All over the world people are looking at their neighbors in a new way. All over the world people are waking up to a new reality to how big we really are. To how little control we really have. To what really matters. To Love.

So, we pray, and we remember that yes there is fear. but there does not have to be hate.

Yes, there is isolation, but there does not have to be loneliness.

Yes, there is panic buying again, but there does not have to be meanness.

Yes, there is sickness but there does not have to be disease of the soul.

Yes, there is even death, but there can always be a rebirth of love.

Wake to the choices you make as to how to live now.

Today, breathe.


Listen, behind the factory noises of your panic-the birds are singing again, the sky is clearing, for the Lord is coming, and we are always encompassed by Love.

Open the windows of your soul and though you may not be able to touch across the empty square, Sing.

WALK-UP HOLY COMMUNION



FOLLOWING THE 10:00 AM LIVE-STREAM MASS

Communion will be distributed in the church vestibule following the live-stream Mass. We ask that you line up using the social distancing markers on the steps and blacktop. Family units may remain together. Volunteers will be there to assist you.

Masks **MUST** be worn at all times. Please use a hand sanitizer before receiving communion. If you are wearing gloves, you must remove them before receiving Eucharist. It is preferred that you receive the Host in your hands for the time being.

After receiving Holy Communion, there will be a table where you may pick up a bulletin and a basket for your Sunday offering, and then please return to your car and depart. The church will not be open for individual prayer during this time.

Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.





Pantry needs- smaller/consumer package quantities are preferred: Nutritional drinks, oatmeal, cream of wheat, grits, cereal, breakfast bars, peanut or almond butter, jelly, mayonnaise, mustard, ketchup, pickles, cans of chicken, beans, salmon, tuna, turkey or Vienna sausage, Spam. Also pasta, rice, spaghetti sauce, ramen noodles, canned or packaged soups, chili, beans or stew. Canned fruits or dried fruits. Packages of pudding, jello or apple sauce or fruit cups. Cookies, chips and crackers. Tea bags or instant coffee.





Clay Dough Advent Wreath

Directions:

- Mix 3 cups all-purpose flour, 1 cup salt, and 2 TBS of cornstarch. Gradually add 1 1/4 cups water and 2 tsp. of cooking oil. Knead clay dough until smooth.
- Divide dough in half. Add green food coloring to one half and knead until evenly colored.
- Divide other half in half. Add purple food coloring and knead as before.
- Divide the rest in half. Add pink to one half and yellow to the other half and knead separately.
- Make the wreath out of the green dough, 3 candles out of the purple, 1 candle out of the pink, and 4 candle lights out of the yellow.
- Place the wreath on a plate. Place the candles evenly spaced in the wreath. Light one of the purple candles.
- Keep the rest of the candle lights in a plastic bag until they need to be placed on the appropriate candle on the next 3 Sundays.
