A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

The purple we wear every Advent has new meaning this year as we find ourselves and county in the purple tier of the pandemic. As I said last Sunday, Advent is part a penitential season and we certainly have done the penance already by abiding by the civil restrictions in the hope of serving the common good of all.

We wear a mask and stay away from close contacts with one another not to protect ourselves from coming down with the virus, but to keep it from others if we might have it. I have celebrated a couple of extremely limited graveside services where in one case the individual had been in the hospital for five months without being allowed any visitors. He passed at the age of 57. His family could finally visit the day before he passed. Then they were all quarantined for 14 days before we could have a funeral. Our actions can affect many, so let us commit at the beginning of this new Church year to live for others as Jesus lived and died for us. Then we can be assured that one day we will be with the great company of saints forever in heaven.

I hope you are participating in the "It's a Wonderful Life retreat". George spent himself for others and every time he almost gets to do something for himself, another needs his time or disrupts his plans. He doesn't and we don't always see this, but I encourage you to participate and maybe appreciate the gift others are to you and the gift you are to many. This is what the short season of Advent is all about. I again quote the wisdom of Deacon Greg Kandra:

"What I say to you, I say to all: 'Watch!' What a powerful way to begin Advent!"

Jesus reminds us: the most important thing we can do to begin this season is open our eyes—and open our hearts. Twice in last Sunday's gospel, Jesus gives his followers this simple command: to watch, to be alert, to pay attention.

But What are we watching for? *The Gospels over the next few weeks give us clues. We will see miracles and wonder. We will see a wild man in the desert, wearing the hair of a camel, eating locusts and honey. We will witness an angel telling a virgin that she will give birth to the Son of God. We will encounter heavenly hosts singing "Glory to God" when this child is born. We will see wise men from afar offering priceless gifts. We will look for a star. Light will pierce the dark and history will be made.*

"Watch!" Jesus says. *What you are about to see is unbelievable. But we believe. As the angel declared to a doubting girl in Galilee: "Nothing is impossible with God." We believe. We hope. We wait. And we watch.*

This is the great call of Advent, our great purpose during these weeks when we cry out to God, pleading with him to come and ransom us while we wait. And we watch.

But what are we really watching for? What do we seek?

Our theology tells us there are three comings of Christ—the time when he was born in Bethlehem, the time when he will return to us at the end of history, and the here and now, when Jesus, Emmanuel, continues to dwell among us.

We celebrate the first coming at Christmas, with all the songs and presents and parties. And we watch and "wait in

*joyful hope" for his last coming at the end of time. **But do we watch for in his other coming, in the here and now?***

Do we actively look for Christ? Are we watching for him? Are we alert to the ways in which he reveals himself every day to a cold and often indifferent world?



This is the Jesus you won't find in the nativity scenes we see. You won't see him in a Christmas special on TV or on a card from Hallmark. You will find this Jesus today in other places—not always where you might expect. He comes to us, as one of our prayers tells us, in "Word and Sacrament." And, significantly, he comes to us in strangers we meet, as well.

*As Mother Teresa used to say, he comes to us in the "distressing disguise of the poor. **Watch him.** He is there on a park bench, at a bus stop, in an orphanage, in a shelter. You will find him in every heart that is broken. You will find him in every child who is forgotten. You will find him in every family that is anxious, or frightened, or hungry or cold. You will find him among those seeking solace and refuge, those seeking comfort and hope. He is with those who are outcast and downcast—all of us who need to be ransomed from suffering or sin.*


He came to dwell among the poorest, the weakest, the smallest. He sought out those on the margins, whom others had left behind. And he comes to us again and again—as he will here, at this altar—in the unlikely appearance of a blessed and broken piece of bread—the divine Messiah, the King of Kings, crumbling in our hands.

This is a moment for us to remember that Emmanuel, the one whose name means "God with us," came to us once—and he is with us still! Advent, this yearly time of prayer and penance and hope, this season of waiting and watching, serves to remind us that he is still here, if only we look for him. So, watch and hope for the Lord is with us!"

On a very mundane note, a few years ago I asked, and you responded with donating several cell phones. Two went to the immigrant families we sponsored. One became the designated St. Theresa emergency phone so one of the priests could be directly contacted when a serious emergency was happening, and someone immediately needed the Sacrament of the Sick.

Fr. Abraham has been the guardian of the emergency phone, but it is slowing down and not charging well. If you are getting a new phone and not trading it in for a discount, we would be happy to replace our current iPhone 7 with the one you are discarding. I can say I do say a prayer for the donor each time we have set on our way to help a parishioner in need.

May Advent bring us a new hope and bring us to a time when the pandemic is conquered! Happy St. Nicholas day today!

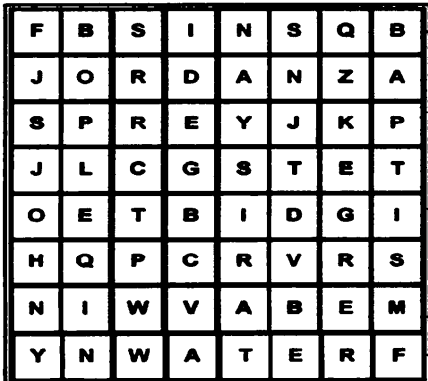

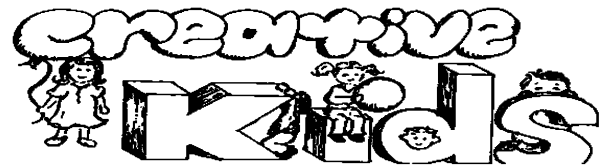

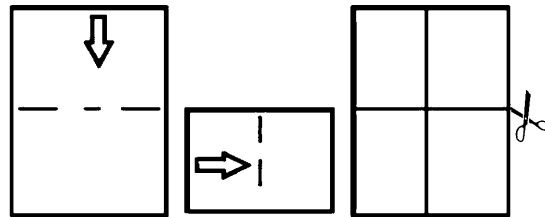
