A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR

We continue to restore treasured parish practices on Sunday, with the annual Men's Club sponsored 'Pancake Breakfast'. The smell of sausage and bacon permeating the church this morning gives us hope of all good traditions coming back.

A few weeks ago, we surveyed your opinion about how we should try to keep down the spread of Covid, the flu and just bad colds. The vote was pretty split, but the majority said they wanted masks to be optional and with that doors open to keep a good air flow within the church. We've tried this option, but many of you have complained that even if there is heat, it goes out of the church quickly and we are uncomfortable while trying to pray, sing and be active participants at Mass.

With that on-the-spot input, we are trying to kick up the heat on Saturday night and Sunday morning, but we also just closed the side inner doors last week. There is still some air flow so we will move forward with this practice. Bottom line, we are all responsible for our own health and well-being and in coming to church we also take responsibility for others. Anyone may wear a mask at any time, but we are not mandating it. If you have a fever, stay home! If you have the flu or Covid, stay home!

As I wrote this two years ago when the pandemic was beginning to rage, you may recover quickly from the cold or flu, but someone else in the church who is immune compromised, may not if they catch something from you. Attendance numbers are increasing each week, which is wonderful for all of us, but with that we should follow common sense and take care of our health and in that the care of others.

At the end of this coming week, the school will have its final day for the year and begin the Christmas break the week before Christmas. I know with the better ease of travel; some will go to visit friends and family throughout the world. My prayer is that all will travel safely, arrive at their destination on time, have a wonderful visit or vacation and return in the new year, happier, and healthy. We will be live streaming our 9:00 pm Christmas Concert and 10:00 pm Christmas Eve Mass if you want to connect with us even on Christmas. May many blessings be upon you as we celebrate God's love for us by becoming like us.

This week, the vestments are rose colored, like the third candle on the Advent wreath. We still call it: 'Gaudete Sunday'. It is a little different when in Lent the mid-way Sunday is called 'Laetare' Sunday. What is the difference between Gaudete and Laetare? **Gaudete means expressed or exuberant joy. Laetare means internal joy, a joy of anticipation felt within the solemn season of Lent.** Yet, it is interesting that both forms of the words are included for this Sunday's antiphon, so we can express both forms of joy as we approach the celebration of Christ's Incarnation.

So, rejoice today! And even better, we also celebrate Holy Mary throughout the short Advent season. Last Thursday was the feast of the Immaculate Conception. We rejoice even in the fact that Mary was born so that she could accept the charge of angel to cooperate with God's plan.



This week we celebrate another American Mary feast, Our Lady of Guadalupe. Franciscan press has a wonderful presentation of this feast:

"The feast in honor of Our Lady of Guadalupe goes back to the 16th century. Chronicles of that period tell us the story.

A poor Indian named Cuauhtlatohuac was baptized and given the name Juan Diego. He was a 57-year-old widower and lived in a small village near Mexico City. On Saturday morning December 9, 1531, he was on his way to a nearby barrio to attend Mass in honor of Our Lady.

Juan was walking by a hill called Tepeyac when he heard beautiful music like the warbling of birds. A radiant cloud appeared, and within it stood an Indian maiden dressed like an Aztec princess. The lady spoke to him in his own language and sent him to the bishop of Mexico, a Franciscan named Juan de Zumarraga. The bishop was to build a chapel in the place where the lady appeared.

Eventually the bishop told Juan to have the lady give him a sign. About this same time Juan's uncle became seriously ill. This led poor Juan to try to avoid the lady. Nevertheless, the lady found Juan, assured him that his uncle would recover, and provided roses for Juan to carry to the bishop in his cape or tilma.

On December 12, when Juan Diego opened his tilma in the bishop's presence, the roses fell to the ground, and the bishop sank to his knees. On the tilma where the roses had been appeared an image of Mary exactly as she had appeared at the hill of Tepeyac.

Reflection

Mary's appearance to Juan Diego as one of his people is a powerful reminder that Mary—and the God who sent her—accept all peoples. In the context of the sometimes rude and cruel treatment of the Indians by the Spaniards, the apparition was a rebuke to the Spaniards and an event of vast significance for the indigenous population. While a number of them had converted before this incident, they now came in droves. According to a contemporary chronicler, nine million Indians became Catholic in a very short time. In these days when we hear so much about God's preferential option for the poor, Our Lady of Guadalupe cries out to us that God's love for and identification with the poor is an age-old truth that stems from the Gospel itself.
